NEW FLAG IS BORN IN JAPAN. (By Associated Press) KANSAS CITY, Mo., June 23.—The new "Christian flag," white with a red cross on a blue field, is floating above Convention Hall, level with the Stars and Stripes during the International Sunday School convention here. The flag, it is explained, is intended as an emblem of the Christian unity which it is hoped the convention will do much to strengthen and further. A rally of young men and women under 24 years of age will be held June 26, coincidentally with the convention. The young people's rally will be in a separate auditorium. Large numbers of young people have volunteered for service during the convention. Some will take part in the pageant of Christianity to be given nightly during the convention, while others will act as ushers at the convention and in charge of information bureaus. Kansas City homes are to be thrown open to the delegates to supplement the hotel accommodations, and Boy Scouts will guide the visitors to the lodgings assigned to them.

MEXICO CITY, June 23.—The body of General Felix Angeles, who was shot two years ago in Chihuahua following his capture by Carranza forces, probably will be brought to Pachuca, his former home, for final interment. A movement to that effect has been started and coincidently a subscription campaign to obtain funds for a suitable monument to the famous artillery expert in Mexico City. General Angeles was one of Mexico's most illustrious military men and during the world war achieved considerable fame in the French army as a master of artillery.
