WANTS U. S. TO HOLD HAITI

(By Associated Press)

WASHINGTON, June 28.—Indefinite continuation of American military occupation of Haiti but with a reduction of the marine force, was recommended in a unanimous report presented Monday by the special senate committee which, for months, has been investigating the American administration of Haiti and Santo Domingo.

The committee found that on the whole American administration in Haiti had been of great benefit to the Haitians, and was so regarded, it said, by a vast majority. The American record, however, was described as one both of "failures and achievement," the report stated, adding that there had been some "blunders" and a few instances of cruelty against natives by members of the military force.

"In brief, under the treaty between Haiti and the United States," the report said, "the peace of the republic, the stability of its government and the security of its people, have been established for the first time for many years."

MINING TOWN IS QUIET NOW

DENVER, June 28.—The mining town of Frederick, Colo., where two men were shot Saturday night, following a scuffle between a crowd of men and Colorado state rangers, has been quiet since Sunday, and the incident is regarded as closed, it was stated Monday by Col. Paul J. Hamrock, state adjutant general. The crowd which caused the trouble Saturday night was simply a group of men from the town who became "excited," Colonel Hamrock said. "The coal miners of Colorado have caused no trouble."

The disturbance Saturday occurred when rangers attempted to arrest a man on a charge of creating a disturbance when under the influence of liquor. A shot was fired, wounding the man, and the crowd which had gathered quickly dispersed, according to reports reaching ranger headquarters here. According to latest reports, the condition of the two wounded men is satisfactory.
