## PHONE EXPERT HAS RESIGNED

SALEM, Ore., June 29.—C. J. Green, chief engineer of the Oregon public service commission will temporarily take over the work of Guy M. Harris, telephone engineer of the commission, who yesterday by request of the commission handed in his resignation, effective July 12. Harris was requested to resign for the reason that he was not considered harmonious with the new organization that followed the recent recall election.

Announcement was made yesterday that H. D. Wagon, Jr., of Portland, has been appointed by the public service commission as an assistant secretary at a salary of \$200 a month. The appointment was made Monday but not made public, the commission explaining that it did not "consider it a matter of any importance."

It was explained that the office is not a new one and has always existed, though no one has filled it for a considerable length of time. W. P. Ellis, secretary of the commission, said today that the appointment really has been made at its request since he has had almost double work since the motor vehicle transportation of the state was placed under the jurisdiction of the commission.

## TWO HURT IN FOREST FIRE

BELLINGHAM, Wash., June 30.—John Meyers, 49th year, and Magnus Anderson, 46th year, on a logging train of the Samish Bay Logging company are in a hospital here suffering from severe burns caused when they drove a train of logs through a forest fire near Alaska fifteen miles south of here, 248 yesterday. Several other members of the logging crew were slightly burned. The train was cut off from the camp by a fire which spread suddenly along the railroad track. Fearing that they would be surrounded, the train crew decided to make a run for the camp. The bridges were burning as the train

passed over them, and one collapsed immediately after they last car had come by. The train was ablaze when it reached the camp. The fire, which for a time threatened the town of Alger, had died down somewhat today. Another fire is reported to be raging near Hamilton.

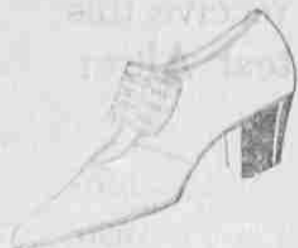
