COMMUNITY IS TO BE AIDED

(By Associated Press)
 KANSAS CITY, Mo., July 3.—The representative form of organization of the International Sunday School Council of Religious Education makes possible "the mightiest cooperation in practical measures in the history of North American Protestantism," Rev. Dr. Rufus W. Miller of Philadelphia, secretary of the board of Sunday schools and publications of the Reformed Church U. S. A., told the convention of the International Sunday School association here today. "This council has come," Dr. Miller continued, "at a time when by cooperation can a national system of religious education paralleling the public school system be possible. The goal is worth every sacrifice."
 "At the door of the child's heart and bidding the youth Godspeed all the denominations should stand together."
 "Building together has been the dominant note of this great convention. It means for the next four years, to phrase it alliteratively, the challenges of cooperation, of confidence, of cash; and a challenge for the Family Circle, for the community, for the child and for Christ and the church."
 "We exist for the community and not the community for us. The evidence of the last few years proves conclusively that communities can get together and do splendid work as cooperating churches of the community, in the establishment of the Community Training School, the Vocational Bible School and the Wesleyan Religious School. One of our great objectives must be the development of religious education for the whole community and not for the isolated units. This is true because a child is the supreme object of our endeavor, and all the children of a community can alone be reached by united endeavor."
 "It is not possible in any other form of church work, for all the denominations to hold together as closely as they can in efforts in behalf of the children."

OREGON TRAIL BID REJECTED

PORTLAND, July 3.—Owing to the inability of the state highway commission and the Umatilla county court to arrive at a definite adjustment of certain financial obligations, action on the contract for the grading and rocking of the 13.6 mile section of the Oregon Trail, designated as the Deadman's Pass-Kameel section, was deferred by the state highway commission Thursday.
 On this project, on which bids had been called for on three previous occasions, two bids were received. The lowest was that of Carlson & Nelberg, who offered to do the work for \$138,122 on condition that they would not be required to finish the job until 1922. It required to complete this year the bid was \$2000 higher.
 No Leap Award Made.
 The bids were taken under advisement pending further negotiations between the commission and the county court.
 For grading and surfacing between Leaside and Enterprise in Wallawa county, a distance of 7.89 miles, the bid of the Warren Construction company, \$193,355 was rejected, and the work ordered re-advertised for the July meeting of the commission, for grading alone.
 Another bid rejected was that of J. T. Lonsman for grading and surfacing a 7.5-mile section of the Old Spring-Pendleton road and re-advertisement ordered.
 The Colonial Building company was awarded the contract for constructing a bridge across the Grande Ronde river near Kinohart, Union county, at \$42,558 and Tobin & Hines were given the contract for constructing four masonry concrete bridges on the Dufur-Tulia section of the Dalles-California highway.

MAN ON TRIAL FOR MURDER

PENDLETON, July 3.—The first murder trial held in many years in this county is now in progress in the circuit court. George Elyart is accused of the murder of Lawrence King, who died at Wallawa May 4, following an attack made Monday, May 29, while at the home of Crawford Hunter on Joseph creek. A coroner's jury held Elyart on the charge of first degree murder.
 The case was brought to trial promptly in the circuit court, being called Monday morning. The jury was completed Tuesday noon and the first witness was called at once. It is expected that the trial will occupy most of the remainder of the week.
 The jury is composed of A. P. Wilson, C. F. Harmon, Charles Johnson, Harry Wade, John Bookout, J. A. Gillaspie, Willard C. Jackson, Dudley Post G. W. Humphreys, N. J. Cook, C. D. Broxson and J. L. Cole.
 The indictment charges George Elyart with killing L. M. King in the head with a rock, thereby causing death.
 The attachment to the jury by A. W. Schupp, district attorney, is the first that Lawrence King's name was at the Oregon State bar, where he held his position for 10 years. He had no relatives here. That he was about 30 years of age and that he had served with the United States army about two years. That he served in the army with Alvah Victor of Smith Mountain, in the same company and in the same squad in Honolulu. That he was a young man of no bad habits, and was just an ordinary young man.

Forest Ranger Floyd Kendall has been making an inspection of the mountains in this district in the past weeks and he reports that the berry crop in the Mt. Emily, Five Points districts and around Kameia, looks exceptionally promising. Reports from other sections in the Blue mountains are also prophetic for a big crop. Only a late frost will nip the huckleberries this year and this is not being looked for.

The berries are expected to ripen in the lowlands a little after July 10, and will continue ripening in higher altitudes until about September 1, which will be the approximate maturing of berries at the highest altitudes.
