### REFUND FOR EMPLOYERS

SALEM, Ore., July 7.—The state industrial accident commission announced that employers who contributed to the industrial accident fund during the last year will, as of July 1, receive a 20 per cent dividend or refund of surplus, the total refund amounting to about \$207,000. This makes three successive years that refunds in this amount have been made.

"With the exception of the two abnormal years when shipbuilding was at its height in Oregon, this has been the biggest year in the history of the workmen's compensation law in Oregon," said members of the commission yesterday. The receipts of the commission have been larger and the volume of work greater than ever before, and at the same time there has been a reduction in the commission's overhead expense.

"Receipts for the fiscal year ending July 1 total \$2,079,639.01, of which \$283,337.62 was received in June. The administrative expense of the commission for the year amounted to \$190,747.84, which is a reduction of \$84,589 from the expense of the preceding year. The entire overhead cost of the commission was but a fraction over 9 per cent of the receipts.

"During the year there were 17,723 claims filed for compensation of injured workmen or their dependents. Of that number of claims 112 were in connection with fatal injuries.

"The number of employers operating under the workmen's compensation law has increased during the year from 8729 to approximately 10,182, a net gain of 1453."
