### ENGLAND WILL GET BENEFITS

(By Associated Press)

ONDON, July 12.—England is about to benefit from what has been done in the United States in the field of producing and distributing pure milk. Ready to learn from the experience of others, the milk committee of the National Farmers' Union sent its chairman, E. W. Langford, to America to investigate. He found out a lot.

What chiefly impressed him was the tremendous extent to which the public generally was interested in the subject of pure milk. It was regarded as a national question. Child welfare organizations, public health and educational authorities made it their business to see to it that everything possible was done to insure an abundant supply. No influence comparable with it was exercised in England.

"In America," Mr. Langford has said, "there is much more inspection of farms than here; producers have to be licensed, and the licenses can be revoked if the regulations are not complied with. Altogether milk production and distribution are on a higher plane than in this country. The question of clean, pure milk is treated by all concerned as one of vital importance."

"One of the chief difficulties in the way of securing better milk in this country is, in my opinion, the indifference of the public," said Mr. Langford. "British people do not take a serious view of the milk they buy. Milk is milk sums up their attitude, and they do not seem to care how or where it is produced. Very often, indeed, those who are interested in buying milk here for public institutions, such as hospitals, buy on contract in the very cheapest market, irrespective of quality or cleanliness. It is all a question of education. If the people here see the necessity of having clean milk in bottles and are prepared to pay the small increase in price, they can have it."

### SWEDISH IRON ORE IN DEMAND

(By Associated Press)

STOCKHOLM, July 12.—Europe has increased its consumption of Swedish iron ore, a fact taken here to indicate that European industries are on the mend.

The biggest iron ore mine in Sweden, the Grönsvärd, Geol. osund company exported through Narvik in 1922 250,000 more tons of iron ore than during the same period of 1921. In May alone this year Narvik cleared 600,000 tons of iron ore, breaking all previous records.

The principal buyers of Swedish iron ore are England, Belgium, Germany and the countries of Central Europe.

### TO USE AMERICAN TEST

(By Associated Press)

STOCKHOLM, July 12.—The Swedish General Staff has recommended that the American army intelligence test be tried out in the Swedish army with a view of adopting it, should it prove practical and successful. It is proposed to experiment on three infantry regiments of recruits under the supervision of Professor G. A. Janderholm of the University of Gothenburg.

### DEMAND MADE ON F. P. GARVAN

WASHINGTON, July 12.—Formal demand was made Monday in New York on Francis P. Garvan, president of the Chemical Foundation, Inc., for the return to the alien property custodian of all patents, former enemy-owned, held to the foundation while Mr. Garvan was alien property custodian.

The demand was made on Mr. Garvan personally by Fred H. Wilson, secretary to Alien Property Custodian Thomas W. Miller, who went to New York Sunday night for the purpose.

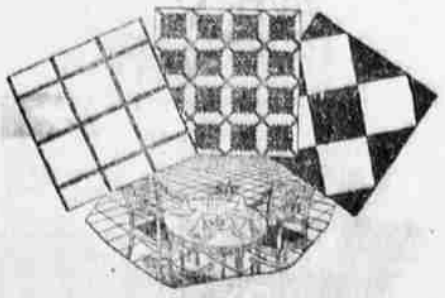

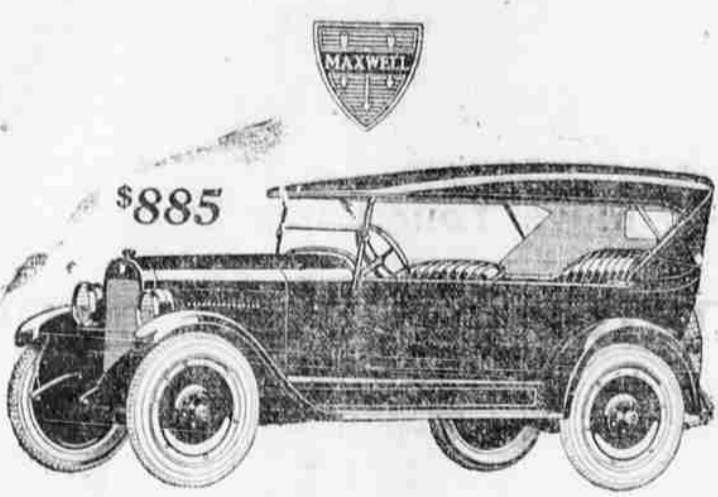
