

BULLETIN IS ISSUED BY O-W

The superintendent's office of the O. W. R. & N. has issued a bulletin, addressed to all employees, containing a resolution passed by the U. S. railway labor board July 21 by a majority vote. The resolution is as follows:

"Whereas, the six organizations comprising the Federated Shop Crafters have notified the Railroad Labor Board that a very large majority of the employees which they represent have left the service of the carriers, that the members of said organizations are no longer employees of the railways under the jurisdiction of the Railroad Labor Board, or subject to the application of the Transportation Act, and

"Whereas, the Brotherhood of Railway & Steamship Clerks, Freight Handlers, Express and Station Employees, United Brotherhood of Maintenance of Way Employees and Railway Shop Laborers, International Brotherhood of Firemen and Oilers, and Brotherhood of Railroad Signalmen of America have also made known to the board that they have not withdrawn ballots on all or a part of the carriers, which may result in the classes of employees which they represent, leaving the employ of the carriers, and

"Whereas, in the future submission of disputes involving rates, wages and grievances of said classes of employees of the carriers, it will be desirable, if not a practical necessity, for the employees of each class on each carrier to form some sort of association or organization to function in the representation of said employees before the Railroad Labor Board, in order that the effectiveness of the Transportation Act may be maintained,

"Now, Therefore, Be it resolved, that it be communicated to the carriers and the employees remaining in the service and the new employees succeeding those who have left the service, to take steps as soon as practicable to perfect an such carrier such organizations as may be deemed necessary for the purposes above mentioned, and

"Be it further resolved, that on any carrier, where either of the above named organizations, by reason of its membership severing their connection with the carriers, ceases to represent its class of employees, procedures similar to that above suggested in the case of the shop crafters, be recommended, and

"Be it further resolved, that the employees remaining in the service and the new ones entering same, be accorded that application and benefit of the outstanding wage and rate decisions of the Railroad Labor Board, until they are amended or modified by agreement with said employees arrived at in conformity with the Transportation Act, or by decision of this board, and

"Be it further resolved that if it be assumed that the employees who leave the service of the carriers because of this dissatisfaction with any decision of the Labor Board are within their rights in so doing it may likewise be concluded that the men who remain in the service and those who enter it anew, are within their rights in accepting such employment, that they are not strikebreakers seeking to impose the arbitrary will of an employer on employees who have the moral as well as the legal right to engage in such service of the American public to avoid interruption of indispensable railway transportation, and that they are entitled to the protection of every department and branch of the Government, State and National."

MANY PERMITS ARE ISSUED

SALEM, Ore., July 12.—During the second quarter of the year, the months of April, May and June, Perry A. Cupper, state engineer, issued a total of ninety-four permits for appropriation of water from Oregon streams for various purposes.

"These permits," said Cupper, "cover the irrigation of 24,973 acres of land, the development of 4200 horsepower, and the use of water for mining, municipal, domestic and various other purposes. The estimated cost of construction work under the permits is approximately \$1,008,000. Included among the permits were two to construct reservoirs for the storage of 47,655 acre feet of water at an estimated cost of \$450,000. Also included were permits to the Ochoco irrigation district for the storage of 17,000 acre feet of water in the Ochoco reservoir, and the irrigation of 22,000 acres of land. The project was completed two years ago at a cost of \$1,350,000.

BRITAIN WANTS TO PAY DEBTS.

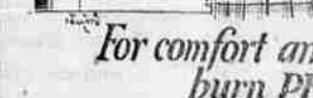

HARD TO HOLD REDS IN CHECK

MOSCOW, July 12. — Working men who were induced to fight for four years in the Red army against the representatives of the bourgeois class—and who now return to Moscow to find white collared speculators dining in luxurious restaurants while they themselves have difficulty in securing black bread or what is going on about them frequently feel like throwing bricks through the windows of these restaurants, one communist recently said to the Associated Press correspondent. Only the party discipline and the promise that this temporary strategic surrender to the capitalists will not last forever have held these disappointed workmen in check, the speaker explained.

"If we would permit it the communist party, instead of numbering 500,000 persons would soon increase to several millions as many men want to get into the government," the informant of the correspondent declared. "But the party is being weeded out and only those who can maintain themselves as spartan communists regardless of what is going on about them will be permitted to stay."
