THE DRAFT HORSES.

The charts will be similar to those displayed by the government at the national dairy show and will be under the supervision of the Department of Agriculture.

ADJOURNS FOR THE SUMMER

WASHINGTON, July 12.—The Court of Claims has adjourned for its summer recess after disposing of an unusual amount of important business. The amount sued for in cases disposed of since the court convened in the fall was about \$25,500,000 and the actual amount involved much larger as many test cases were disposed of upon the result of which depended large numbers of similar cases. This was particularly true of cases arising out of the late war, a great number of which were passed upon.
The government was successful in securing the dismissal of a considerable number of petitions, and, in some cases, in obtaining judgment for large amounts, notably in the case of the Gulf Refining Co. in which the government obtained judgment for \$199,000 and which was a suit brought to recover \$8,700,000 for value of fuel oil, and the dismissal of the petition of the claimant's business, the government setting up a counterclaim for money
