According to Ordinance No. 726 and No. 727, Series of 1913, it is the duty of every owner, agent or occupant of any lot, block, or parcel of land within the corporate limits of the City of La Grande, to cut and remove all grass and weeds therefrom and also all grass and weeds in front of any such property up to the curb line at least once each

year, between the first and twenty-fifth day of July.
Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof before the Municipal Judge of said City, be punished by a fine of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$20.00 or by imprisonment in the city jail for not less than 20 days.
In the event that any person or persons, firm or corporation shall fail to cut the grass or weeds as provided by this ordinance the same shall be done by the City of La Grande by or under the direction of its Street Superintendent, and the entire costs and charges incurred thereby shall be declared to be a lien upon the lot or property owned by any such person or persons, firm or corporation, where such nuisance exist.

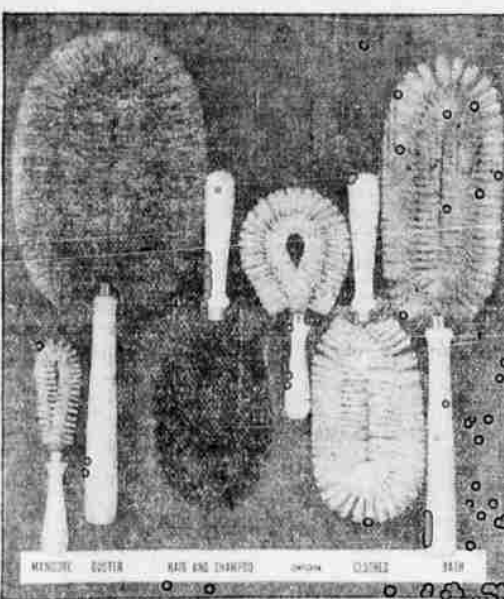
