

DIRIGIBLE TO BE A MONSTER

PHILADELPHIA, July 15.—A monster dirigible, the ZR-3, is being built in the district factory of the Philadelphia Navy Yard. It is to be fully as big as that ill-fated Zeppelin of the air, the ZR-2, which collapsed and fell flaming into the Hudson river in November last summer bringing a terrible death to more than a score of its crew. As fast as the parts are completed here they are sent to the factory at Lakehurst, N. J., which will be the home port of the giant ship. It is expected that by next April the ZR-3 will be ready for its first flight.

This dirigible will be the first of the Zeppelin type to have been built in this country. Commander Westervelt and his associates in the naval aviation bureau, say being started in the construction of the ZR-3 by the tragedy of similar craft.

A principal difference between the Philadelphia built dirigible and that which collapsed over Hull is the strengthening of every second longitudinal ring instead of every third ring as in the ZR-2. This strengthening is accomplished by tying each section of the 25 steel rings together, which will make up the framework, with the strongest possible strands of copper wire. Seventy miles of such copper wire will be used, and the result, it is said, will give the framework a resistance greater even than if constructed of steel. Furthermore, in an alloy of aluminum and copper and is used because of its qualities of lightness and strength.

The work of assembling the ZR-3 is already underway at Lakehurst under command of Commander Norfleet. Three of the rings are erected in the hangar and the rest will be completed within a few weeks.

The envelope will be 200 feet long and 85 feet in diameter. The cloth will be of staple made spun cotton in one continuous length. A specially devised vertical will make it run and waterproof. Nineteen balloons, which will furnish the lifting power are being built in Akron, Ohio. These will have a total gas capacity of 2,500,000 cubic feet. It is not considered likely that helium, from which balloons gas can be used because of the immense quantity that would be necessary.

Originally this invention was to equip the ZR-3 with seven liberty balloons capable of developing a total of 2,100 horsepower, but have experts are experimenting with a new type of motor, the smallest of which is a 100-horsepower motor, but which will still be the type used.

When the ZR-3 is completed, experts say it will have power to cruise one-third of the distance around the world without having to descend. It will have a lifting power of 85 tons. The average speed is estimated at 100 miles an hour, its maximum 75.

Questions for the officers and men will be along the highway extending almost the entire length of the ship. They will have a width of eight feet and a height of seven.

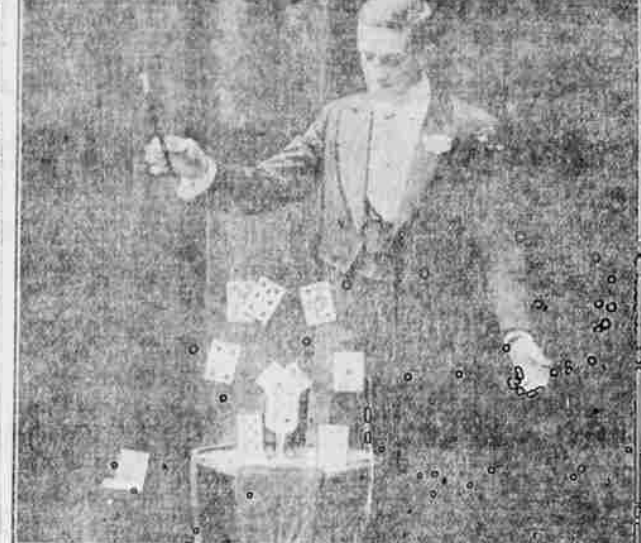
