NEW JAPANESE STAR IS FOUND

TOKIO, July 17.—This year's tournament of the Tokyo Lawn Tennis club has brought in the first another Japanese star and an aspirant for next year's Davis Cup team in Mr. Fukuda, who defeated Nishimura, last year's champion by straight sets 6-0, 8-0, 6-0. MANY GOT RICH IN A HURRY

LONDON, July 17.—Many men who ten years ago were fairly well-to-do now drive their own automobiles. That counts like an eagle from a score about California or some other American state whose farmers sometimes make a lot of money. But it isn't. It is taken from a report of the big profits made in Hampshire, Kent, Warwickshire and a few other counties of this old land by farmers who raise fruit and particularly strawberries. Such tales are not often heard in a rural land. English farmers, as a rule, take more delight in telling tales of woe than of well-being. Giving details of this agricultural prosperity, the report says: In one case a man cut up a field of 15 acres in acre plots and offered it to the laborers of the parish. He had arranged the payments to extend over ten years, but nine of the 15 purchasers paid for it the first year. Within four years all the rest paid up. One of them during the last three years has sold 1,000 pounds worth of strawberries from his one acre plot. "It is not to strawberries alone that such men turn their attention. They make good profits out of plums, apples, cherries, gooseberries and currants. "At the time of the great agricultural depression Gladstone suggested that farmers should grow

OIL STATION FOR WALLOWA

WALLOWA, July 17.—Wallowa is to have an oil station of the Wallowa County Oil company soon, according to E. E. Johnson, the manager, who was in town this week making arrangements for the immediate installation of a tank on a location near the railroad tracks. The company, which already has a station at Enterprise, has its headquarters at La Grande and is a subsidiary of the W. S. Oil company of La Grande, which is the only Oregon oil concern with local offices in the state. The gas and oil is shipped from one of the largest independent refineries in the country. A 15,000 gallon tank is to be installed here soon, with more coming later when the demand necessitates. Mr. Johnson, who is financially interested in the concern, believes that Wallowa County Oil company will not only be successful here, but will also render a service to the county and keep the money spent for these products within the county.

OLD LOGS TO BE UTILIZED

ENTERPRISE, July 17.—It will be a relief to people who drive the north road to know that the decks of logs which have been piled beside it since the highway was built are to be utilized. The lumber company, which brought the logs from the forest service on the road was cut through the woods, has sold them to G. S. Hamilton and E. L. Bond, who will reduce them to firewood and load them to town. Mr. Bond will take a power saw to the woods and cut the logs to regulation length and split them into common shims. Hamilton will bring them to town on trucks. He has converted the rear part of a truck form used in town into a trailer, which will be able to handle a double load of shims. This will give something to do through a dull season in town when roads are good and also will give a new supply of fire wood.

HOPE FOR SETTLEMENT. WASHINGTON, July 17.—Following a two-day conference of President Harding and E. P. Grable today at the White House, a statement said the maintenance of way leaders expressed hope for early settlement of

the strike. Grable called a meeting in Newark for next week. All general bodies and executive officers have been invited.

RUMANIA GETS INFORMATION

BUCHAREST, Rumania, July 17.—Rumania has been given some first hand information as to the immigration laws of the United States. A high government official called recently on a member of the American legation here and said: "We have 5,000 poor Jews out at Kishineff and nearby points, all refugees from Russia. We have decided to send them to the United States. How shall we go about it to get rid of them as quickly as possible?"

Japanese Are More in Number in the Islands This Year

HONOLULU, T. H., July 17.—The number of American citizens of Japanese ancestry who voted in Hawaii this year increased by 312 since the 1920 elections, according to a statement by Raymond C. Brown, secretary of the territory. The Japanese voters numbered 979, composed of 882 males and 89 females. The total registration of the islands is 28,895, as compared with 26,335 in 1920. The number of registered male Hawaiian voters this year was 51 less than the total of that group in 1920.

Indians Prosperous On Reservations

HOQUAM, Wash., July 17.—Indians of the Quinalt reservation up the coast from here are prosperous this year for they have just completed their best salmon season, during which their catch totalled 250,000, which they sold for \$125,000. The catch was the largest, with one exception, ever made by the Quinalts during a season. The price of 50¢ a fish was the greatest they ever received. Several of the Indians realized several thousand dollars profit on the salmon run alone. They sold their catch to three canneries near the reservation.

DRIVERS LOSE THEIR LICENSES

SALFORD, July 17.—Secretary of State Sam Bone and State Traffic Chief T. A. Rafferty today put on rubber heels and iron gloves and announced that the reckless driver in Oregon must go. If he can't drive in a safe manner, he won't drive at all, the officials declared. Four automobile pilots have lost their drivers' licenses within the last week and more are to follow if that course appears to be the only one in preventing their activities, it was said. "The drunken driver is one of the greatest menaces on the highway, and we are prepared to take drastic action to see that he goes," Mr. Kuzer declared. "We will cooperate to the limit with officials of the state." State traffic officers, he said, will be given instructions to watch carefully for motorists who risk their own lives as well as those of other persons on the road.
