OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, July 19.—An address by Roy Rodgers of the San Francisco Bulletin editorial staff, a free excursion to Newport, swimming in the college pool, a banquet cooked and served by students—among the entertainment features for the visiting editors of the state when they assemble for their annual convention July 21 to 22.

The summer season water carnival is booked for one of the evenings during the meeting of the scribes, and diving, marionades and several champions will perform for the visitors. The address by Mr. Rodgers on "The Newspaper as an Educator" will be given July 21, the speaker being obtained by the college, which is cooperating with the local newspapers and the Corvallis chamber of commerce in working out a program of interest. Dancing, swimming, fishing and seafood supper are offered as times of interest in the Newport trip, which comes at the end of the meeting.

## PICTURES WERE TAKEN IN TRAIN

BERLIN, July 19.—A theft of valuable paintings which occurred four years ago has been announced by the Frankfurt police issuing a proclamation to the effect that "a collection of pictures were stolen from a railway carriage of the Swiss and German division en route from Frankfurt to Germany November 8, 1918. Included were a portrait of the Spanish Infante by Velasquez, two works of Rubens, a Van Dyck and other old masters. A reward of 1,000,000 marks is offered for their recovery." No information is given as to why the pictures were on the way from Brussels to Germany or to whom they belonged.
