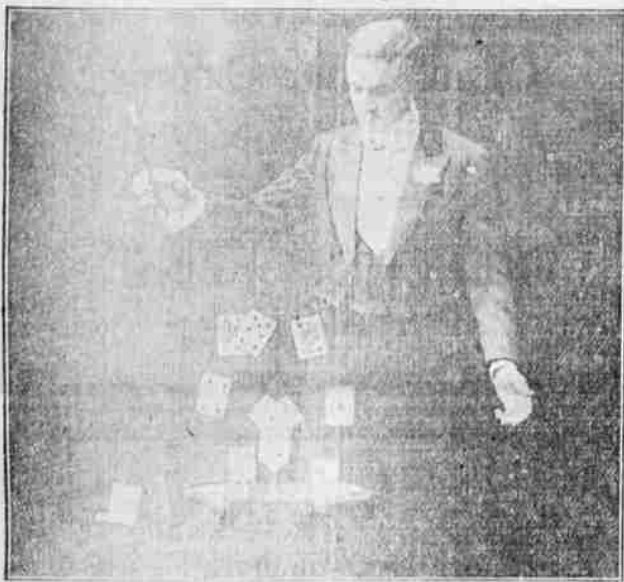


# Unusually Good Numbers at the Chautauqua
