AT SHERRYS—LAST DAY "THE HUNCH"

One of the gayest screen comedies ever produced was seen last night at the Sherry Theatre. A clean, crisp, clever conception is "The Hunch," and it shows Garoth Hughes, who rose to stellar prominence in "Garments of Truth" and "Sentimental Tommy," in the merriest bit of characterization that he has contributed to motion pictures. As a young New York broker who is arrested and accused of his own murder, his winning is felt at its happiest. He is a decorative young man, is Mr. Hughes, and he acts with the technical perfection and instinct for just the right touch that justify Mrs. Fiske's characterization of him as one of those who are keeping the fires of genius kindled in the theatre.

The picture was produced by George D. Baker for S. L. (Arthur Sawyer and Herbert Lubin) and is released by Metro. The story by Percival Wilde appeared first in the Popular Magazine. The photography is by R. J. Bergquist and the technical direction by E. J. Shuter.

Mr. Hughes is supported by an excellent cast that includes Ethel Grandin, who retired at the height of her popularity, and who now returns to the screen looking more daintily than ever; Gale Henry, who used to lead her own company in comedies and who now has a deliciously funny character role as an amateur detective; Edward Flanagan, who, as the young broker's friend, earns more laughs than he ever did in his popular "Hallroom Boys" production; John Stepping, Harry Lorraine, boisterously amusing as the sheriff, and William H. PRINCE RESTING FROM HIS TOUR

LONDON, July 24.—With the exception of a luncheon given in his honor by the City of London Corporation, the Prince of Wales will undertake few, if any, public engagements during the next three months.

Toward the end of September it is probable he will "play himself in" as Captain of the Royal and Ancient Golf club at St. Andrews and there is every probability that the fixture will be treated as one of the utmost interest and importance throughout golfing circles in Great Britain. The prince's first ball from the tee will be redeemed in traditional fashion and will become a treasured possession of the club.

Buffalo Bill's Mail Carrier Died Recently

SPOKANE, July 25.—Abraham Runyon, mail carrier for Buffalo Bill when the Indian fighter was in a campaign on the Yellowstone, died at the Spokane county poor farm, where he has been an inmate for the last two years.

"There is no question about Runyon having served as mail carrier for Buffalo Bill," said J. S. McCormick, superintendent of the poor farm. "He was a fine fellow and was about 65 years old."

"He was told me about carrying the mail on a one-wheel cart. Poles were fastened to the wheel drawn by horses and he sat on a seat behind the wheel with the mail."

"Runyon lost an arm in a railroad wreck and drifted here two years ago. He suffered from a swelling in his feet which made it impossible for him to work."


