REBUILDING OLD HAPPY CANYON

The Associated Press. PENDLETON, Aug. 4.—Talent at the 1922 Round-Up will include the 1921 Round-Up, according to word received from the sons and daughters of the round-up and plan will compete here September 11, 12 and 13.

Raw Bell, last year's champion, who first rode in the big show when he was a mere tripling of 14, will enter the list again. "Yak" Canutt, three time a champion, will be here, as well as Hugo Strickland, also a former champion.

Added to these stars of the Round-Up constellation will be scores of others who have won laurels in the bull-dogging, broncho riding, steer roping and races, and still others who will be here will include Tom Mix, celebrated motion picture star, and fifty cowboys skilled in the art of throwing a rope and riding bronchos will be entered in the contests.

Pendleton is making extensive preparations for the show, the grounds and grandstands are being put into shape and everything is being placed in readiness. The Round-Up is strictly a community show, according to the officials in charge, staged by an association of Pendleton's prominent citizens, who serve without salary, and who have the backing of every citizen in the town. The show pays no dividends, all profits being used for prizes and improvements to the grounds.

Happy Canyon, the little brother of the Round-Up, which will provide entertainment for the evening hours, will be staged in improved quarters. The old pavilion is being rebuilt and a new one constructed.

ASTORIA ENJOYS BIG FISH CATCH

ASTORIA, Aug. 4.—There was a decided improvement in the catch of Chinook salmon, especially in the north channel stream of this city, and in the Hogback and Prairie channels above Tongue Point. The largest single catch reported was at the Hogback and consisted of 85 salmon, which weighed over 2500 pounds. Other catches ranged from 500 to 1700 pounds. In the lower harbor the hauls were not large.

The salmon taken are of fine quality and average well over 50 pounds. That a new crop of Chinook has en-

tered the river is certain, but how long it will continue remains to be seen. Last year full—60 per cent of the salmon pack was out in August and the first sign is raising hope in fish-bog circles that this season may prove a repeater in that regard.

It is estimated that not less than 50,000 cases of Chinook have been put up this season.

A fleet of 27 fishing boats was reported at Astoria today, waiting for the fog to clear away, when they will resume fishing outside the three-mile limit.

Traction Firm on the Sound Buys Auto Bus Line That Competes

SEATTLE, Wash., Aug. 4.—Stone & Webster interests have extended their transportation system to Olympia by the purchase of the Olympia-Tacoma auto bus line. It was admitted yesterday by officials of the Puget Sound Electric Railway company.

According to reports from authoritative sources, the purchase of the Tacoma-Olympia line, which gives Stone & Webster a virtual monopoly of passenger service from Seattle and Tacoma to the state capital, involved \$150,000, and was accomplished by a transfer of the auto bus system operating to Aberdeen and Hoquiam.

The Mount Vernon-Everett stage line was purchased last December, and has been truckly operated as a Stone & Webster transportation system.

Since auto bus service has been established to Olympia the line of boats which formerly connected the capital with Tacoma and Seattle has discontinued its service.

EXPOSITION CARS TO TOUR STATE

Portland 1925 Fair Committee Plans to Visit All Sections with Message.

PORTLAND, Aug. 4.—The Atlantic-Pacific Highway and Hydro-Electric exposition positively will be held in Portland in 1925.

This unqualified statement was made Tuesday night by Mayor Baker, vice chairman of the managing committee, in announcing plans for an auto caravan which will leave Portland August 14 for a tour of the state in the interest of the fair.

Franklin T. Griffith, chairman of the managing committee, has asked Mayor Baker to take full charge of the campaign to be waged in Portland and throughout the state in the interest of the exposition and the mayor has accepted the charge. As the opening gun of the campaign, he has arranged for this caravan tour which will consist of 30 cars, representing all the civic organizations of the city.

Organizations Line Up. Tuesday the Chamber of Commerce, Realty Board and Lions club pledged support to the movement. Today other civic organizations are being lined up by the mayor.

The route will take the fair caravan through the central and eastern parts of the state, returning along the Columbia River highway. Included in the cities to be visited are: Salem, Albany, Corvallis, Eugene, Roseburg, Grants Pass, Medford, Ashland, Klamath Falls, Bend, Prineville, Pendleton, Elsie, Stanfield, Hermiston, Arlington, Moro, Wasco, The Dalles, Mosier, Hood River, and Cascade Locks. Stops also will be made at Crater Lake, the Gorge hotel and many smaller towns of the state. Portland will be reached on the return trip August 28.

ANACORTES, Wn., Aug. 4.—With Paul F. Wells, of Billings, in the chair, the annual three-day convention of the Washington State Elks' association will open here on the morning of August 17. Outside of the conven-

tion hall, the gathering will be featured by a parade, athletic events and entertainment on "Relieving Row." Included in the opening day's program will be a baseball tournament and horse racing in the afternoon. In the evening there will be drill team competition, a ritualistic contest and dancing. On the morning of August 18, in addition to convention business, there will be a scenic tour of Decatur Falls, a baseball tournament and a state Elks' baseball.

In the afternoon there will take place a musical band parade, a band contest and Indian water festival and horse racing. The dinner to the next evening will be given in the evening and a pavement dance will close the day's celebration. A "Grand Elks' Parade" will be held the following morning, as well as the finale in the baseball and golf tournament. 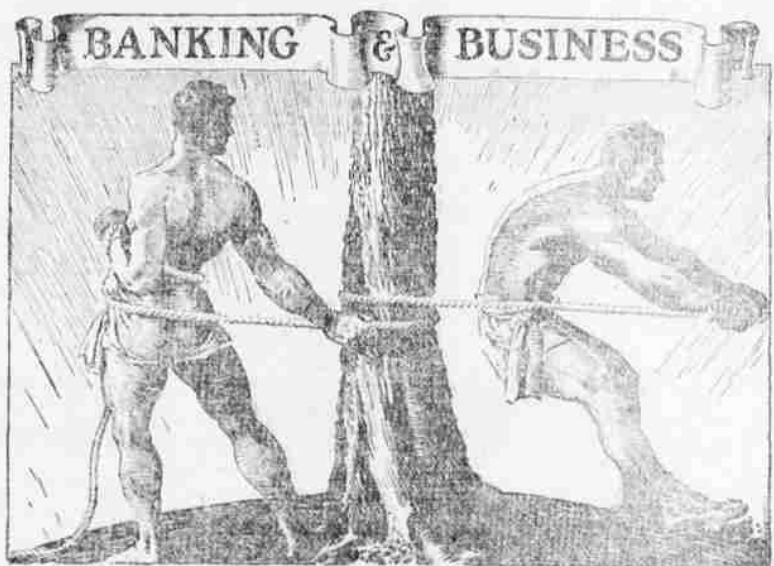
