

# TWO AVOWED WETS RUNNING

### Indiana Has Two Candidates who Speak Out and They are for Wets.

(By Associated Press) INDIANAPOLIS, Aug. 7.—While the prohibition question is not expected to enter into the fall campaign in Indiana, at least two candidates for congress—Charles A. Bidman, in the fifth, and Joseph P. Turk, in the seventh (Indianapolis), both democrats—are known to be avowed "wets," and they made their campaign for nomination on that candidates, 12 of whom are incumbents, are considered "dry."

In addition to the two avowed "wet" democrats, Charles W. Bransator, in the fourth district, received the support of the wets in his pre-primary campaign, but prohibition was not an issue in the fight. Harry C. Canfield, in the fourth, was an avowed wet two years ago, but since has become an advocate of prohibition enforcement.

James A. Clifton, in the sixth, is neutral, while Wm. P. Spooner, in the tenth, has never indicated his stand in public. The other democratic candidates, Miss Esther O'Keefe, in the thirteenth; William E. Wilson, in the first; Arthur Greenwood, second; John W. Tyndall, eighth; George L. Moffett, ninth, and Samuel E. Cook, in the eleventh, are dry. The democrats, at present, are without a candidate in the third, owing to the death of John Ewing, who was nominated in the primary last May.

The republican candidates for congress, all of who are "dry," are: first, Oscar R. Lohring; second, Oscar E. Bland; third, Samuel A. Lambdin; fourth, John S. Bonham; fifth, Everett Sanders; sixth, Richard N. Elliott; seventh, Merrill Moore; eighth, A. H. Vestal; ninth, Fred S. Purnell; tenth, Will R. Wood; eleventh, Milton Kraus; twelfth, Louis Fairfield; thirteenth, Andrew J. Hickey.

# LEGION MEN USE RIFLE

(By Associated Press) INDIANAPOLIS, Aug. 7.—Regulations for the championship rifle meet on the athletic program for the national convention of the American Legion at New Orleans were announced today. The meet will start October 14.

The department winning the team competition will receive a handsome loving cup which will be retained until the 1923 national convention. In addition all members of the winning team are to receive gold medals, while silver and bronze medals will be awarded to the teams finishing second and third.

Louisiana already has started and has finished the coaching of the best rifle clubs in the south. The rifle program follows:

Regulations governing all competition: Rifles: To be government Springfield, Model 1903, as issued. Sights: Any metallic sight not containing glass. Ammunitions: 150 grains. Firing regulations: other than shown on program: To be governed by U. S. Rifle Marksmanship. Matches to be fired: First day: One team from each state consisting of four firing members of The American Legion, one alternate and a team captain, who may be a firing member of the team.

# GET YOUR WAVE LENGTH EARLY

(By Associated Press) STOCKHOLM, July 17. (By Mail) —"Apply for your wave-length now, or you will be left out in the cold," was the warning advice given to Sweden by E. T. W. Alexanderson, of New York, chief engineer of the Radio Corporation of America, who is making a brief business visit to Sweden, his native land. The Radio corporation has entered its bid for delivery of apparatus and equipment for the new high-power wireless station which Sweden is now building on its west coast.

In interview with the Stockholm Press, Mr. Alexanderson, a well-known radio expert, explained that only an extremely limited number of trans-Atlantic radio stations could be operated successfully without serious interference. He said that various countries had already reserved most of the wave-lengths suitable for trans-Atlantic communication, and only a few were left. The wave-lengths best suited for such long distance transmissions, are between 16,000 and 20,000 meters. The wave-lengths between 11,500 and 17,000 meters have been reserved, while Poland has applied for the 18,000 meter length.

Mr. Alexanderson declared that in his opinion radio traffic should be monopolized by the various governments of the world. Otherwise, he said, the confusion in the air will become so great that all radio service may ultimately be rendered impossible.

The awarding of wave lengths to trans-Atlantic stations is now made by an international commission whose next session will probably be held in London this year.

# JAILED JAILOR IS CANDIDATE

### (By Associated Press) Kentuckian Who Served Sentence in His Own Jail Running for Congress.

FRANKFORD, Ky., Aug. 7.—Ten Kentucky congressmen, eight of them democrats and two republicans will go before the voters in tomorrow's primaries asking for reelection. Charles F. Oden, of Anchorage, republican, will not ask for his seat again from the voters of the fifth district and Maurice H. Thatcher of Louisville, has no position at the primaries. This district normally is republican.

Political observers believe the political complexion of Kentucky's delegation in the next congress will be about the same as it has been for two years. R. Y. Thomas, democrat, in the ninth district is unopposed tomorrow, but probably will have a stiff fight in November. Three republicans are seeking the nomination in this district and in the past it has been a political battle ground as the voters are about evenly divided as to political affiliation.

Political battles are not on the stage this year as many of the candidates have no opposition in the primaries and there are no republican candidates in the sixth and seventh districts.

The eight democratic incumbents have opposition for re-nomination in only the seventh and ninth districts, while John M. Robinson, the republican incumbent from the eleventh district, is unopposed for re-nomination.

John W. Langley, of Pineville, the republican incumbent from the tenth district, has one opponent, Pess Whitaker, widely known as the "jailed jailor" of Letcher county, who, while serving as jailor of Letcher county, was convicted on charges of turning out prisoners charged with felony and of bootlegging and assault.

# DOROTHY ASKS FOR FREEDOM

### (By Associated Press) LOS ANGELES, Aug. 7.—Dorothy Clark, the 16-year-old dancer, in whose behalf her mother, Mrs. Ethel E. Clark, of New York, has brought suit in Los Angeles for \$200,000 damages against Herbert Rawlinson, motion picture actor, plans to take action soon to annul her recent marriage to Karl Elms, of Boston, according to a story the Los Angeles Examiner published Thursday.

Miss Clark arrived here Wednesday, according to the Examiner, and said she had come to take action in the annulment matter and also to watch the trial of the suit against Rawlinson, who, her mother alleged, attacked the girl in a New York apartment, nearly two years ago.

The girl was quoted some time ago as declaring her mother's allegations against Rawlinson were untrue. Rawlinson denied them.

# MANY MEMBERS NOW IN GERMANY

### American Chamber of Commerce Roll Near the 2000 Mark.

(By Associated Press) BERLIN, Aug. 7.—A membership mark of 2,000 is rapidly being approached by the American Chamber of Commerce in Germany, as compared with a maximum enrollment of 350 before the war. The chamber was established in 1903 for the purpose of promoting trade relations between the United States and Germany, and especially the promotion of American foreign trade.

For the past four or five months it is officially stated, more than 100 applications for membership have been laid before the board of directors at each of its monthly meetings. The constitution of the chamber provides for two classes of membership.
