

# CAMERAGRAMS

REMEMBER THIS BRIEF ADVICE from the U. S. coast guard if you hear a swimmer cry for help:

ONE—Pull the victim in over the stern of your boat to prevent capsizing. Lay him on his stomach across the seats and row for shore, taking care that he doesn't swallow his tongue, even if you have to tie it with a shoestring. The motion of the boat will remove most of the water he has swallowed.

TWO—stretch him on his stomach, feet together, with his face to side to permit breathing. Extend arms as in photograph to expand lungs.

THREE—Kneel. With hands on victim's short ribs, thumbs parallel with spine and your fingers spread, slowly bring your weight to bear on his body as you count "one, two." Release pressure as you count "three, four." This makes a complete respiration movement every four seconds.

DON'T GIVE UP! Many cases are on record where persons have been revived after several hours' work.



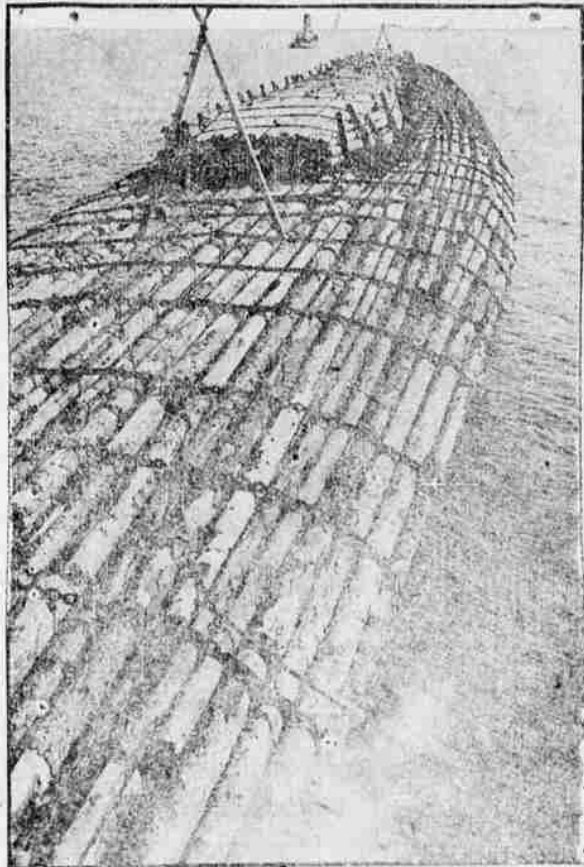

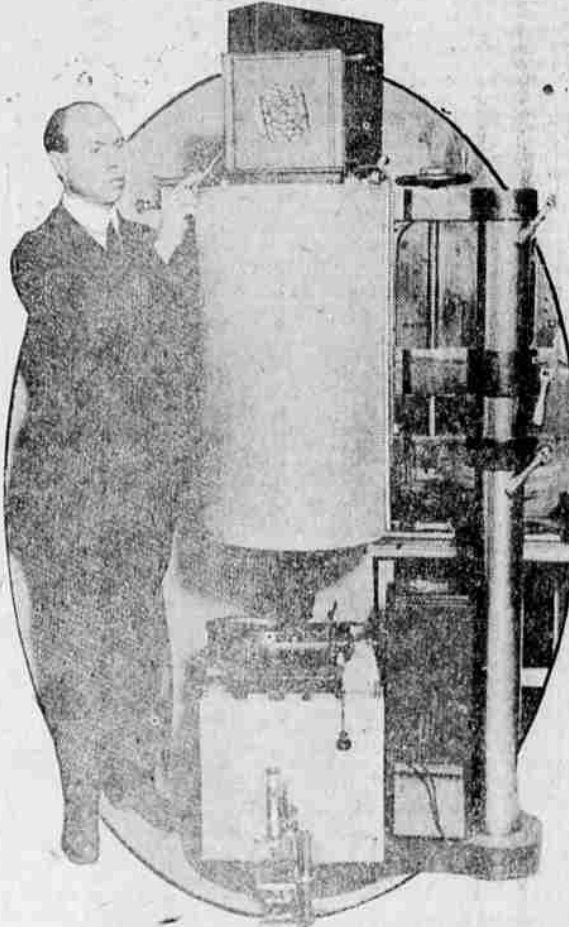

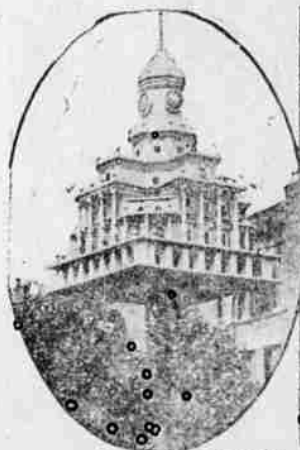

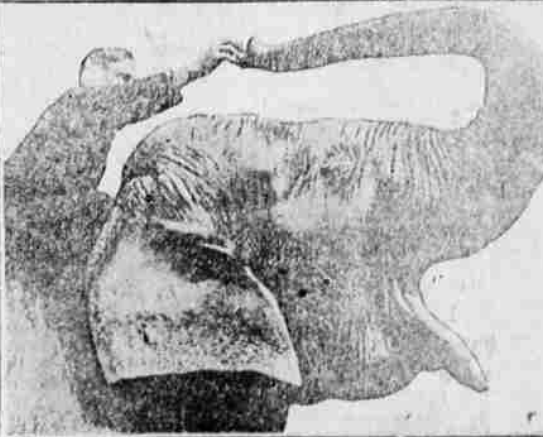
