

# HOME RULE AIDED BY KHALIFAT

## Khalifat Movement in India Has Large Part in Movement Toward India Home Rule; Hindus Return Support.

(By Associated Press)

BOMBAY, Aug. 14.—The Khalifat movement in India which, several months ago, brought about a revision of the Sevres treaty, has had a large part in the movement toward India home rule. Hindus, seeking Mohammedan support for the Swadeshi agitation for self-government, have seen fit to support the Khalifat movement in return. The Khalifat movement, unlike Swadeshi, is wholly Mohammedan in its aims. Originating in a protest against the peace terms which the allies offered to Turkey at the close of the war, it seeks the restoration of the Khalif's temporal power and the freeing of Mohammedans from Christian rule. The claim regarding the Khalifat calls for leaving the Turkish Empire as it was at the outbreak of the war, except that, although the allegations of Turkish misrule are not admitted, the non-Turkish nationalities may, if they so desire, be granted autonomous government within the empire.

The minimum demand was stated by a deputation to the Viceroy in 1920 as follows:

"Arabia, as delimited by Moslem authorities, and the Holy Places of Islam must remain under the control of the Khalif, full guarantees being taken, consistently with the dignity of a sovereign state, for a free Arab self-government should be established in Arabia. We advise the use of the word 'Khalifat' because the present arrangement is thoroughly distrusted by the overwhelming majority of intelligent Moslem opinion.

"Islam has ever associated temporal power with the Khalifat. We therefore consider that to make the Sultan a mere puppet would add insult to injury and would only be understood by Indian Moslems as an affront given to them by a combination of Christian powers."

In India the Khalifat movement has identified itself with the All-India Moslem League, which has been in existence since 1906. During recent years the league and the Indian national congress have, to a large extent, joined forces. The session of the league is now a pale shadow of the session of the congress, and the resolutions coincide with those of the congress except that there is greater emphasis on the Khalifat question.

Although the Mohammedan population of India is only about seventy million, or less than one-fourth of the total population, the Mohammedans exert a much greater political influence than their number would warrant.

# PORTO RICO HAS MIRACLE HEALER

## Sick, Lame and Curious Visit San Lorenzo to See Juilita Vazquez, "the Miracle Healer," Who Lives Near Spring.

SAN JUAN, P. R., July 19. (By Mail).—Extra policemen have been detailed for duty at San Lorenzo to help handle the crowds drawn there from Wednesday night to late Friday each week by the stories of apparent cures by Juilita Vazquez, the "healer of San Lorenzo."

Hundreds, if not thousands, of automobiles carrying the sick, lame, and curious have been visiting San Lorenzo and so great have been the traffic jams that there have been complaints to the police that the San Lorenzo road was impassable. On Thursday last, there was a line two miles long on each side of the roadway waiting for people who are rapidly wearing into a broad trail the cow path that lead up the steep hills to the spring from which the supposedly healing water comes. Thousands go by motor to the "healer" and more thousands on foot. From Caguas and other nearby towns there has sprung up a regular motor service to and from the place of "miracles." People go by truck loads. They go in carriages, carts and some are carried. Stories of "miracles" are spread with wonderful rapidity through the crowd each day, and there are reports of people coming from Santo Domingo or the Virgin Islands to get the water blessed by the "healer." Some make a fiesta of it; others are almost reverential.

The healing spring is about a mile from the town where the "healer" lives. Near the spring a palm-covered pavilion sheltering 400 to 500 people has been erected. There Thursdays and Fridays the healer sits in a chair on a raised platform and receives the sick. Waters from the spring lack healing qualities until she has blessed or magnetized them. After being blessed the water is carried away in bottles, buckets, oil cans, anything. And each person the "healer" sees is told to bathe, rub the afflicted portion of the body with the water, or drink so much of it at certain times.

Frequently the "healer" is aroused from her trances with great difficulty. Her father and a brother assist her. Her "power" is supposed to have been passed to her, while the spring waters for many years have been reputed to have healing qualities. It was about two months ago that the "healer" first

# ENGLAND BARS AMERICAN RADIO

LONDON, July 24.—(By Mail).—American and other foreign wireless apparatus will be excluded from use by British broadcasting firms if a recommendation of Postmaster-General Kinnear is adopted by the Cabinet. Mr. Kinnear urges that for a period of two years licenses for broadcasting should contain a provision that only British instruments be used. Following the example of American journals, the British newspapers and magazines are devoting volumes and columns to wireless topics. But broadcasting in this country is in an almost nebulous stage, and wireless receiving by the masses has not attained anything like the popularity it enjoys in the United States. The government is slow in inaugurating a general broadcasting scheme.

Some newspapers are warning amateurs to be careful about cheap receiving sets—some of them of American and French origin—which are being widely offered.

"If broadcasting were officially established in England the whole picture would become clearer," W. W. Drury, managing director of the Marconi company, said recently. "However, the Marconi company anticipates a large demand in the future for receiving sets and it is turning out many thousands of them. When the winter evenings come and people want to sit at home and listen to the outside world there will be a great increase in the demand."

# TWENTY HOGS SHOW INCREASE

EUGENE, Aug. 14.—One of the farms selected for hog feeding demonstrations in Lane county is that of J. W. Maxwell. Mr. Maxwell runs a dairy of eight cows, farms some 150 acres of land and utilizes the by-products on the farm with three O. F. C. blood sows and a boar. The object of the demonstration is to emphasize the value of some of the farm wastes as a means of raising hogs.

The sows farrowed September 10, bringing twenty-four pigs after first litters were counted out. All of the twenty-four were kept up to weaning time. The sows and boar together with the twenty-four pigs were allowed free run of a grain stubble pasture. They were fed 1000 pounds of grain in addition. November 25 the weaner pigs were weighed up. There were at that time twenty pigs as four had been sold for breeding stock. These twenty pigs weighed 1194 pounds. In other words, Mr. Maxwell has 1194 pounds of pork with no outlay besides the 444 pounds of grain.

The sows and boar are in excellent breeding condition and are receiving ample feed from the droppings of the dairy cows which are eating some twelve pounds of grain daily. This lot of twenty pigs will be continued on test. They will receive some skim milk and a grain ration of vetch screenings, wheat and barley equal parts.

They weighed an average of 59.7 lbs on November 20, at eighty-five days old.

Mr. Wiley Maxwell of Lane county, living near Eugene, was a co-operator with County Agent Whitney and the Livestock Specialist of the Extension Service of Oregon Agricultural College in showing the value of skim milk for hog feeding.

# KING'S HORSES MAY BE SEEN

## If the Policemen Consent, Any American May See All the King's Horses; Suspicious Character a Bar.

LONDON, July 24.—(By Mail).—The Earl of Chesterfield goes up to his ancestral home, and any American in London who wants to visit the King's stables at Buckingham may do so, and feel he is welcome, unless by chance he has done something which causes him to be regarded with suspicion by Scotland Yard.

First he applies to the Earl, who is "Master of the Horse," and once in receipt of the Earl's polite note giving him permission, the rest is easy. Few horses, even those of American multi-millionaires, are better housed than those of the King, and no American multi-millionaire, unless he goes in for racing extensively, has so many of them.

The stables are built in the form of a quadrangle. Rows of wide, roomy stalls are on either side of a long chamber, with a lofty arched roof. Each stable can accommodate scores of animals, but the population of the Royal Mews has shrunk considerably in recent years until now but 85 splendid specimens of carriage and riding horses remain as against the normal figure of 165 in pre-war days.

Each horse has his name over his manger, and has his special duty assigned to him on the roll of the Master of the Horse. Here are the state coach horses, the Queen's barouch horses, the King's chargers, the horses of the Prince of Wales, Prince Henry and others.

The principal attraction of the coach houses is the great state coach which is used for excursions and a few other very special occasions when Royalty is expected to put on all the style it can muster. It weighs 45 tons, is 24 feet long and was built 100 years ago.

In the adjoining harness room is displayed in large glass cases, the eight sets of red morocco leather harness overlaid with gold used by the eight horses that draw the great state coach. Each set of trappings is cut from a complete hide so there is no joint in the leather. Gunmetal overlaid with gold was used for all the

metal work, the eight sets costing \$15,000.

The Master of the Horse has very little to do with the practical running of the royal stables. That is done by Captain Bealby. He is far too great a sportsman for work of this kind. He is paid \$2,500 a year and must be a new to be qualified for his position. He is a political appointee, and when there is a change in the political complexion of the government he is among those who lose their jobs and have to make way for somebody who is of the same political faith as the party that has come into power.
