RUSSIANS HAVE HIGH DEATH RATE

GENEVA, July 22.—(By Mail.) Reports to the Health Section of the League of Nations show that in the Kharkov district of Russia early this year people were dying at the rate of 40,000 a month, or a mortality of 600 in every 1,000. Between March 1 and 20, 125,000 persons died of hunger.

Of the 3,125,277 inhabitants of the Tartar Republic 2,500,000 had died of starvation by March. From January 1 to March 15 there were 392,300 cases of infectious disease.

In the Ukraine cholera was spreading and the death rate was 60 per cent. There was a grave lack of medical supplies, and hospital accommodation had decreased by 80 per cent.

Up to May 2 the number of cases of typhus in Soviet Russia, the Caucasus and Central Asia was 513,319, compared to 320,000 during the corresponding period last year. There were 467,078 cases of relapsing fever.

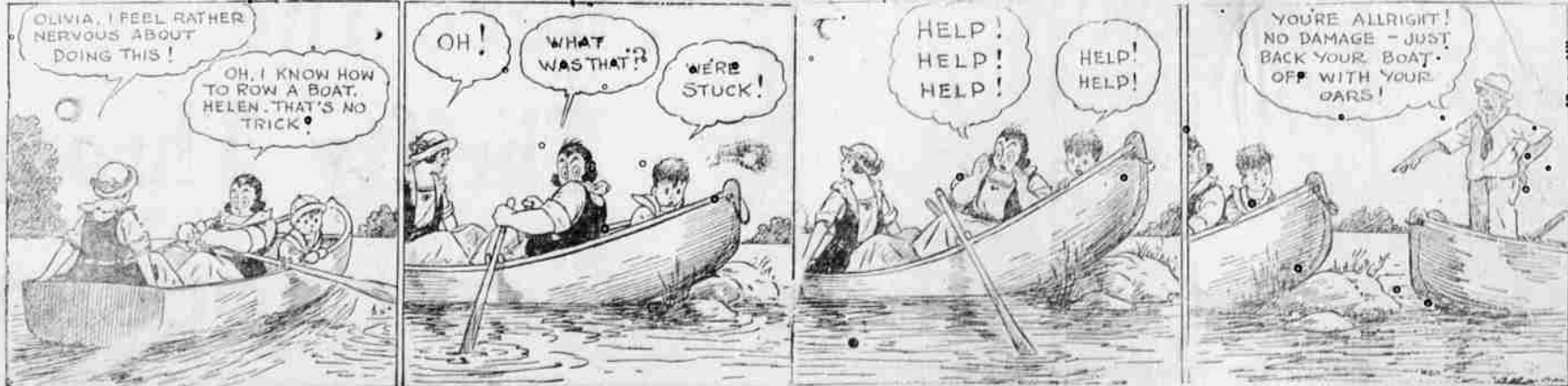
