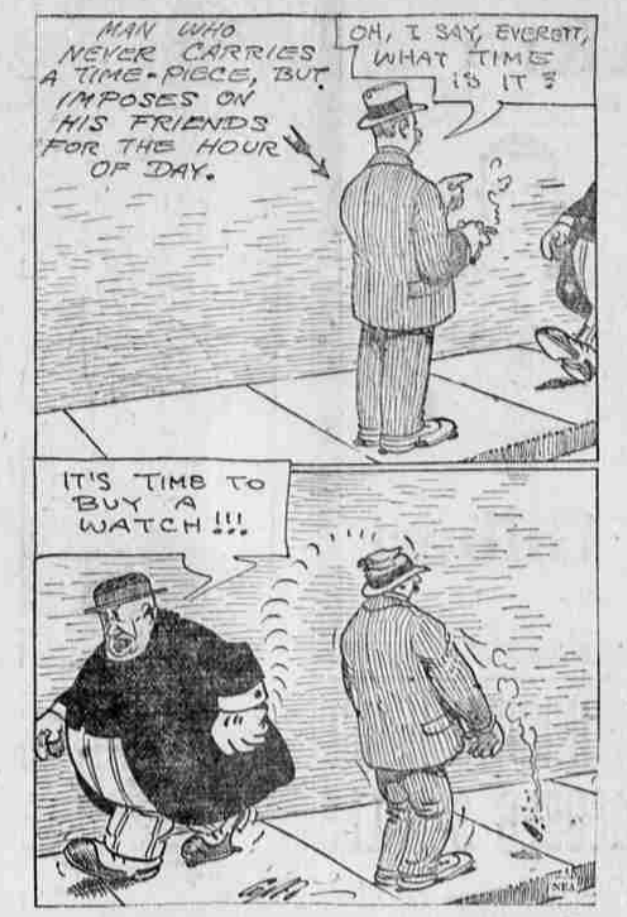

## ADVISORY BOARD DONE IN POLAND

WARSAW, July 14. (By Mail)—The American Technical commission to Poland, working under the direction of Colonel A. H. Barber, will bring its activities to a close this summer.

This commission was formed in 1919 to advise the Polish government on transportation problems. Now that the Polish railroads are practically restored, the work of the commission is at an end. The help of Colonel Barber has been fully appreciated. In proof of this he was the first American to receive the order of "Polonia Restituta," established by the Polish government as a mark of honor to those who have served with distinction in the reconstruction of the new republic.

## BRITISH BOXING CHAMPS NAMED

 LONDON, July 28. (By Mail)—Official holders of British boxing titles have been announced by the British boxing board of control. The various champions are: Heavyweight, Joe Beckett; Lightweight, J. Bloomfield; middleweight, Ted Kid-Lewis; welterweight, title in abeyance; flyweight, E. Rice; featherweight, Joe Fox; bantamweight, J. Harrison; and flyweight, Jimmy Wilde. One boxer may not hold the championship of two classes, the board ruled, thus preventing "frank" contests.
