

BANDIT DIES WITH BOOTS ON

Alexander Antonoff, Termed the Reincarnated Robin Hood, Fought to Finish; Died with His Boots On Near Tamboff.

TAMBOFF, Russia, July 14.—(By Mail)—Alexander Antonoff, whom his followers considered in the light of a reincarnated Robin Hood, but whom the Soviet government, charged as a fast borseman from the Steppes, has surrounded and killed by the state police at his hiding place in a tiny village near Tamboff late in June.

Antonoff once was in the old Russian army. When the Bolsheviks took power he opposed them and, gathering about him thousands of followers, fast borsemen from the Steppes, he harried the Red army in the south of Russia for several years.

Last September Antonoff's last band was broken up by the Reds. For months the state police sought out his hiding place. Finally some of his former confederates were promised amnesty and betrayed him.

Early one June evening eight men led by Policeman Pokulkin came to the hut of a peasant woman, Marie Katesanova, whose name will go down in the fantastic legends surrounding the life of Antonoff. In his hut in the thick woods near the river Vorona, Antonoff was hiding. The police called to him and he came out of the house. Antonoff was there. No sooner had the woman turned away than two men started firing upon the police from the windows of the hut. Peasants, attracted by the shooting, ran to the village church and rang the bells and hundreds of peasants armed themselves with sticks and stones and formed a cordon about the hut.

For several hours the battle continued until, with night at hand, the police ran very short of ammunition. Two of them crept up to the house and set the roof on fire. As smoke began to pour out of the windows, two men broke out from the house and started running toward the woods. With each step they turned to fire their revolvers at the police. They had almost reached the woods when they were shot down. Their bodies were immediately identified, one being the famous chief, and the other his brother, Dimitri Antonoff.

To convince the population that the bandits never had been workingmen, the Soviet authorities had autopsies performed and doctors issued statements saying that neither of the brothers ever occupied himself with hard work, "for their hands were soft like those of noblemen and there was fat all over their bodies, showing that they had fed themselves very well at the time when the famine in the village carried away many souls."

ECONOMY URGED IN SWEDEN

STOCKHOLM, July 26.—(By Mail)—To secure exact and reliable data on living costs and economic conditions in the household, the official Bureau of Statistics of Stockholm is endeavoring to set up a system of bookkeeping in families of the middle and working class.

The Bureau furnishes a simple family budget and housekeeping book free to all applicants, and it encourages especially families with yearly incomes from 3,000 to 6,000 kronor to adopt the plan. The Bureau offers a small compensation, about 40 kronor to any-

one who keeps the accounts for a full year, while three cash prizes of 150, 100 and 50 kronor will be presented to those showing the best kept books at the end of 12 months.

The average food cost index figure shows that today in Sweden the retail price level is about 78 per cent above the prices which prevailed in July, 1914.

SOVIET TO BARTER COAL

MOSCOW, July 14.—(By Mail)—An agreement for the export of Russian coal has been signed by the Soviet representative at Milan with an Italian company.

By it the Soviet government has undertaken to deliver in Italy 200,000 tons of coal from the Don Basin and 30,000 tons of mineral oil, while the Italian company has agreed to supply the Soviet government with railroad rolling stock, other railroad materials, installation for coal mines, and agricultural machinery.

The Italian company agrees to make its shipments before receiving the Russian coal and oil. Another clause of the agreement provides for the increase of the amount of coal to be exported to the Italian company by mutual agreement. The agreement is to become operative within five months from the date of signing.

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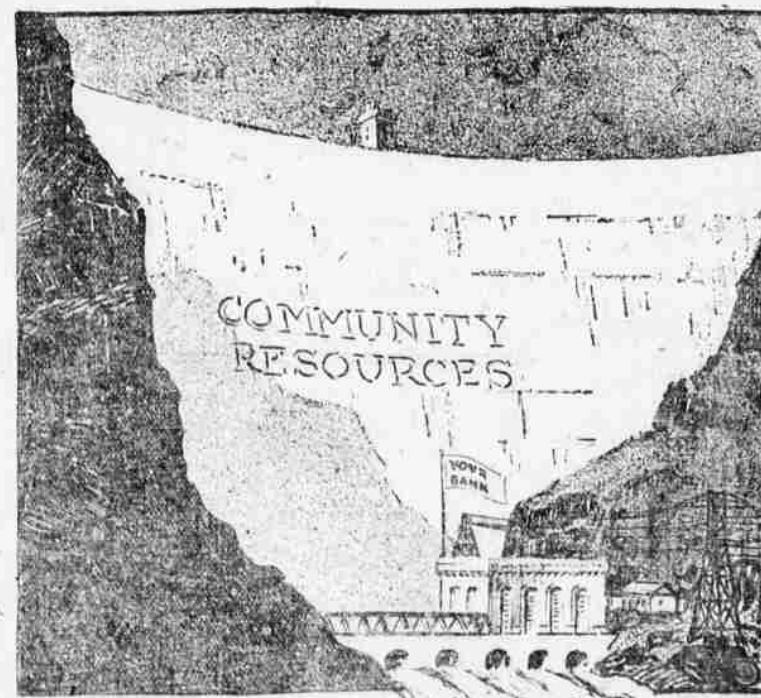
