SEENA OWEN IS SPLENDID IN "BACK PAY"

Seena Owen, whose performance in "The Woman God Changed," has been described as one of the finest examples of dramatic acting ever seen in motion pictures, again has the leading role in "Back Pay," a new Paramount picture created by Cosmopolitan Productions showing at the Arcade theatre today, Friday and Saturday.

The story was written by Fannie Hurst. In "The Woman God Changed" Miss Owen depicted a woman who from the start was "bad" and who gradually comes, through hard experience, to see the light of righteousness and clean living. In "Back Pay" she has once more a role in which she is first seen as an unsophisticated country girl who is later plunged into the vortex of New York's wildest life.

As Hester Bewins, Miss Owen undergoes a moral breaking down, but shining through the mask of her gayety is a faint longing for the upright simple life she had led in her small town home. Playing opposite Miss Owen is Matt Moore, well remembered for his parts in "Straight is the Way" and "The Passionate Pilgrim." Mr. Moore, in the character of Jerry Newcombe, is the plain, straightforward country boy who loves Hester in spite of her rejection of him, in spite of her leaving the town where they live and in spite of the life she subsequently leads. It is Jerry's undying love for Hester that is the keynote of the dramatic story of "Back Pay."

AT SHERRYS "DOUBLING FOR ROMEO" WITH WILL ROGERS

There seem to be no limits to the comedic possibilities latent in Will Rogers, the Golden West cowboy star. Each new photoplay in which he appears is more humorous than his predecessor. Besides, Will Rogers never seems to exhaust his supply of comic gestures, for each situation in which he finds himself, calls forth an original comic response.

Mr. Rogers portrays a cowboy lover whose sweetheart refuses to listen to his bashful love-making. She will have none other than the man who can make love like a "movie" hero. Consequently, the cowboy lover goes to the "movies" to learn how to make love. His experiences at the studios are the most humorous scenes Will Rogers has ever played. After those experiences, he is still the bashful lover. But he learns of a chap named Romeo; and, after reading about him, dreams of himself as a modern Romeo. What happens in the dream is a rich satire on Shakespeare's immortal love-drama.

The story was written by Elmer Rice, who wrote "On Trial," one of the most successful modern plays, when he was only twenty years old. He has been associated with the Golden West scenario department for the past two years.

Clarence Badger, who directed "Doubling for Romeo," has directed Will Rogers in nearly all his pictures.

One of the unique features of this photoplay is the satirical titling, founded on Shakespeare's play, which was done by Will Rogers himself. The picture is one of the most humorous and cleanest photoplays ever produced.

PRO GOLFERS TO MEET SHORTLY

(By Associated Press.) PITTSBURGH, Aug. 17.—The difficult Oakmont Country club golf course here will be the scene from August 13 to August 30, of the annual tournament of the Professional Golfers' association. Those in charge of arrangements for the championship event declare that about three score of the national leading pros will be in Pittsburgh to play.

The qualifying rounds will be played on many courses in the country before the real tournament gets under way at Oakmont. Only American professionals will be permitted to enter.

Pittsburgh will be allowed five regular players in the tournament, under a recent ruling of the P. G. A. However, the Pittsburgh golfers will be called upon to fill the places of qualified professionals from distant points who may be unable to make the trip.

The Oakmont course, scene of the national amateur championship play several years ago, is considered one of the best courses in the United States. There is a severe penalty for every misplay, hook or slice. Oakmont is well-trapped with trees, sand and bunker hazards.
