BEARS FACING HARD SCHEDULE

BERKELEY, Cal., Aug. 12.—Undeafened for two seasons, the University of California football team, weakened by the loss of nearly its entire veteran line, will have to fight harder than ever to hold to its habit of moving down every eleven it meets.

For California, the coming season looks to be an "off year" at this date, yet the student body has faith that Coach Andy Smith will whip together another eleven to gain the Pacific Coast Conference championship.

Many think California will be handicapped by the schedule, which calls for two games away from home, one against the University of Washington at Seattle and the other against the University of Southern California at Los Angeles. Another contest of the home gridiron will be the "big game" against Stanford University at Stanford. Every team on the schedule is "pointed" at the California game, especially those eleven which will be met on their own grounds.

California has a wealth of back-field men but few good linemen. Inside of the "off year" which will be able to take care of "Frank" Muller, the "hunkiest" All-American star, and Bob Herker, another veteran, Charlie Erb, veteran quarterback, will equip the team. There are so many good backs that Smith is considering making use of them, possibly Jack Walker, line tackle.

Freshman prospects at California this year are bright, for among others entering, there will be at least eight stars of the high schools at Santa Ana and Los Angeles.

SCHOLARSHIP HAS CLIMBED

WALLA WALLA, Wash., Aug. 12.—The restaurant's annual standards of fraternities and societies for last year at Whitman college, compared with previous years for last year, show that average scholarship has steadily climbed. This year's average for men and women is \$0.66.

Kappa-Kappa, women's nonfraternity group, stands highest. Kappa-Kappa, nonfraternity group, leads the men. The average of fraternity women is higher than the average for all women in college and much higher than that of nonfraternity women. The average of all college students is above the college average. Fraternity men average slightly below nonfraternity men.

All women's organizations stand above the college average and all the men's organizations, with the exception of Kappa-Kappa house, stand below it.
