

ENDOWMENT DRIVE BEGINS

(By Associated Press.)
 EUGENE, Aug. 18.—As the first step in a campaign to obtain an endowment fund for the University of Oregon, a mass meeting of citizens of Eugene was held here recently to outline plans for the drive and to form an organization.

President P. L. Campbell of the University of Oregon addressed the meeting and told of the gifts that have already been given the university and others that have been promised. He declared that a great deal more money must be obtained to erect buildings to meet the growing needs of the institution. He said that the millage tax is entirely inadequate to meet the running expenses of the university and at the same time provide a fund for the erection of new buildings.

The University of Oregon never has received any large gifts of money, the largest being that of \$30,000 given in 1887 by Henry Villard, pioneer railroad builder, Villard hall, one of the oldest buildings on the campus was erected from this fund. The \$200,000 women's building was erected two years ago largely with money donated in small amounts by hundreds of individual citizens and organizations of the state.

POLES' EXPORTS EXCEED IMPORTS

 WARSAW, July 17. (By Mail).—Polish imports today consist largely of cotton and metal manufactures, while her exports are oil, timber and textiles. In spite of the high rate of exchange, the United States holds second place in the list of countries supplying Polish imports. Poland is still importing in larger amounts than she exports.

TO HAVE APPLE PACKING SCHOOL

 SPOKANE, Aug. 18.—Plans have just been announced here for the establishment of a Spokane Valley apple packing school in the warehouse of the Spokane Valley Growers' Union at Opportunity, ten miles east of here. The school will open August 24 as an extension of the Washington State College.

The courses will be under the direction of experts and these completing the work in a satisfactory manner will be given a certificate of graduation from the college. Plans call for two classes with a limit of 75 pupils each. Each course will run for about a week the length of time considered most suitable for covering the course.

Students will be expected to attend at least eight lectures and sessions and will be granted certificates when able to demonstrate to the expert in charge that they understand grade and pack methods and can put up satisfactorily the standard packs.

YANKEES VISITING SCANDINAVIA

 COPENHAGEN, July 28. (By Mail).—After a week's visit to Denmark, a party of 18 traveling American students has left here for Norway and Sweden.

The students are visiting the Scandinavian countries under the auspices of the International Students' Tours and in co-operation with the American-Scandinavian Foundation. James Creese, secretary of the latter organization, and Professor Benson, of Columbia University, are conducting the tour. After a short visit to Germany and France, the students here will join the rest of the 350 American students, who arrived in Europe on board the Savonia, and return with them to the States.

During their stay in Copenhagen the students, mostly undergraduates from the various American universities, have been entertained by the American minister, the Copenhagen Municipality, the Copenhagen University and the Danish Students' union. They have visited museums and other places and institutions of interest under the guidance of first-class Danish experts.

CHILE TRADES WITH PITTSBURGH

PITTSBURGH, Aug. 18.—The largest single consignment of electric apparatus for railroad electrification ever made in this country started from Pittsburgh recently when the Westinghouse Electric International company despatched the "International Trade Special," on its way to the coast.

The special, made up of 33 cars, carried equipment for the electrification of the state railroads of Chile. It was the second such shipment, the first having been made several weeks ago. A third will follow shortly. The contract with Chile involves \$7,000,000 and includes 39 locomotives. The consignment, now on its way to South America is valued at \$750,000.

From Pittsburgh the "special" goes to South Philadelphia, where the material will be loaded on a steamer for transit to Valparaiso by way of the Panama Canal.

The waters of the Rio Colorado will be utilized in the generation of the power to be furnished to the Chilean state railways, the initial electrification of which will include 144 miles of track, 116 miles from Valparaiso to Santiago and 28 miles from Las Vegas to Los Andros.

CUBA CUTS SALARIES

 HAVANA, Cuba, Aug. 2.—(By Mail).—Congress has decided that the country is being overcharged when it pays \$50,251 a year for each of its 24 senators and \$12,950 a year for each of its 120 representatives.

Under an economy program the senate has agreed to reduce its quota by \$25,000 a year and the house by \$25,000, bringing the congressional budget to \$1,718,000. This will bring the figure for a senator to about \$21,250 a year and a representative to \$19,000.
