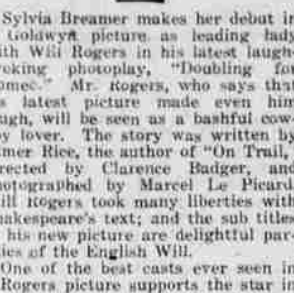

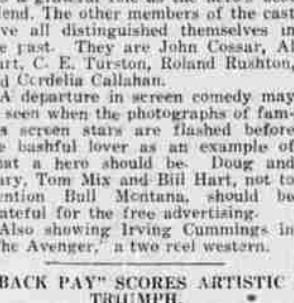

Disabled War Veterans Are Asked to Meet a Government Agent. For the purpose of interviewing all disabled World War Veterans of this community relative to government compensation, vocational training, hospitalization and war risk insurance, L. H. Wood, special contact representative of the United States Veterans' Bureau, will arrive in La Grande August 20 for a period of seven days according to an announcement received here today.

Mr. Wood stated in advance communication that all former service people who can prove that they are disabled 10 per cent or more because of war service are entitled to federal compensation and that those who are unable to carry on their pre-war occupations because of war injuries are entitled to vocational training at the expense of the government. Veterans seriously ill from war disabilities should be hospitalized immediately, he stated. Hundreds of veterans, it is believed, are also ready to re-engage.

REDDING, Cal., Aug. 18.—Keswick, an old copper smelter and mining town near here, which had a population of close to 2,500 in 1900, is soon to be taken from the face of the map. Several years ago the big smelter which provided employment for hundreds, was moved away and now the completion of an aerial tramway makes Keswick unnecessary as a loading point of ore.

Recently the postoffice was moved away and the handful of inhabitants remaining are preparing to "back up and go." The buildings that are now torn down will be left to decay. Keswick was founded in 1895 and for several years was one of the most important towns in the northern California copper belt.

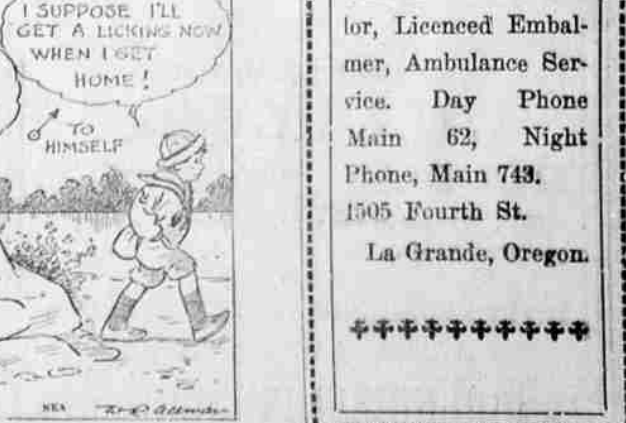
