PLANS GOLD CUP REGATTA

Commodore Wood Says Annual Gold Cup Regatta Being Prepared; Also International Motor Boat Sweepstakes.

DETROIT, Aug. 22.—Plans are being shaped for the annual Gold Cup regatta, to be held here September 1 to 4, inclusive, and for the International Motor Boat Sweepstakes, the 150 mile runabout event for \$25,000 to be run September 2, next year. It is announced by Commodore Gar Wood, president of the Yachman's Association of America.

The International Sweepstakes event will bring to the winner the largest purse in the history of aquatic speed events. The boats entered must be runabouts limited to a maximum engine cylinder content of 1.550 cubic inches, a minimum length of 25 feet and beam of five feet, and a passenger of not fewer than two.

Commodore Wood announced selection of commodore Frederick R. Still of the Detroit Yacht club as chairman of the race committee. He has been in charge of gold cup races held here in the past.

The gold cup program is complete. Nine events will be run during the four days, with 11 trophies offered the winners. Two of the prizes are for extreme speed in two of the events.

On top of the added features of this year's regatta will be the Ladies Bear Cat race for boats of that type. The event will be over a ten mile course, with the women permitted to carry one man in the cockpit of each runabout. The women, however, must handle their craft themselves, the male member of the crew being permitted to assist only in the event of emergency. This race will take place Sunday, September 3.

The following events will be run off in three heats on September 1, 2 and 4: Gold Cup, 90 miles; Detroit Trophy, 60 miles; Hood-Fish, or Trophy, 150 miles; Sultan Trophy, 15 miles; Motor Yacht Trophy, 15 miles. The Sunday events, in addition to the women's race, are: Commodore Charles W. Kotcher Trophy, 20 miles; The Detroit News Trophy, 20 miles; Miller Chinese Race, 10 miles. The Detroit Times Trophy is offered for the fastest boat in the Gold Cup and the H. C. Stutz Trophy for the fastest boat in the Detroit Trophy race.

This program will take in any type of power boat from the out board engine row boat to the express cruiser. The multi-engine hydroplanes of the Miss America type are barred from all events, however, except the Miller Chinese race. The Sultan Trophy, a handicap for cabin cruisers, which last year drew an entry list of 29 cruisers, is expected to set a new entry record this year, as S. E. Sallan has offered a \$1,000 silver service.

MISSIONARIES TO MEET SOON

Methodist Missionary Society will Meet in Baltimore on October 24-31.

(By Associated Press) CHICAGO, Aug. 22.—The general executive meeting of the Women's Missionary Society of the Methodist Episcopal church will be held at Baltimore, Md., October 24-31. It was announced today by Mrs. Evelyn Riley Nicholson, Chicago, president of the society. Mrs. Nicholson is the wife of Bishop Thomas Nicholson, resident bishop of Chicago.

The general executive is a representative body consisting of officers and delegates from all parts of the United States and missionaries from sixteen foreign countries in which the society works.

There are 617,553 members, of which 459,514 are women and 158,039 are children. In the maintenance of its work the Women's Foreign Missionary Society last year spent \$2,200,000.

The work of the society in foreign lands is evangelistic, educational and medical. It has 620 missionaries in service. Among the speakers at the Baltimore meeting will be Dr. John H. Mott and Bishop W. F. McDowell of Washington, D. C.

Bishop F. J. McConnell of Pittsburgh and President Mary Woolley of Mt. Holyoke will report the recent commission on education in China of which they were members. Bishop F. B. Fisher of Calcutta, India, will speak on the present educational situation in India as it relates itself to the church.

Mrs. W. P. Thirkield, president of the Woman's Home Missionary Society, will speak on Mexico, her present home. Among other speakers will be Dr. Ida Sandler, Vellore, India; Bishop Anton Bast, Copenhagen; Dr. Thomas Jesse Jones, member of the Pan-American Commission to Africa.

Other officers of the organization are: vice-presidents, Mrs. F. F. Lindsay, Minneapolis, Minn.; Mrs. Francis J. McConnell, Pittsburgh Pa., and Mrs. William F. McDowell, Washington, D. C.; secretary, Mrs. Charles Smith, Madison, N. J.; and treasurer, Miss Florence Hooper, Baltimore Md.

MILDEW ON RED CLOVER

(By Associated Press) WASHINGTON, Aug. 22.—The first infestation of mildew on red clover in this country this year has appeared east of the Mississippi from Wisconsin to Georgia, says a report of the agricultural department. This mildew makes the plants look white. Last fall it was quite prevalent in the south and is worse there this summer.

The amount of harm it does is a question yet unanswered, it was said, and the department is anxious to learn of effects noted. Some reduction in the yield of hay is due to it, but this is not great. There are rumors, however, that the eating of mildewed hay causes inflammation in horses' mouths.

The Ohio experiment station reports a notation that mildewed clover hay causes stomatitis in horses.

The exact identity of the mildew on American clover has not been determined, it was added. When American clover seed is planted side by side with European seed, the mildew appears on the plants from the American seed, while only a trace of mildew appears on those from the European seed.

ESTIMATE OF SUGAR CANE

(By Associated Press) WASHINGTON, Aug. 22.—The area of sugar cane, not including sorghum cane, in the eight principal states producing sugar cane, is estimated by the U. S. Department of Agriculture to be 521,200 acres, or about 90 per cent of the harvested cane acreage of 1921. This is a preliminary estimate and includes the acreage intended to be harvested for seed and sirup, as well as for sugar.

The acreage that will be harvested for seed cannot be satisfactorily estimated at this time, it was said, as it depends largely on the price received for sirup and on other factors not yet operative.

Louisiana has 295,500 acres planted to cane this year according to the preliminary estimate, or more than one half the total acreage of the eight states. Alabama has 79,000 acres, Georgia, 35,000; Mississippi, 37,200; Florida, 29,000; Texas, 17,500, and Arkansas, 2,500.

Crews in levees along the Mississippi river and other rivers are reported to have destroyed 2,700 acres of cane in Louisiana, and flood in the Rio Grande valley destroyed a large part of the cane in that part of Texas.

Runs to Patents. The first United States patent was granted to a descendant of a Waterbury (Conn) miller. The second was granted to a resident of Waterbury, and the number of patents now issued to people of that city is about double what might be expected from the population.
