CRIME CASES ON DECREASE

TOKIO, July 15.—(By Mail)—Criminal cases are gradually decreasing this year, according to the investigation of the Department of Justice. The number of crimes committed during the month of May were 32 less than during the preceding month and 325 cases less than during May last year. The criminal cases in the army and navy were seven cases more than during the preceding month and 135 less than during May last year. During the month armed robberies numbered 2,274 and murders 2,945.

JUDGE MUST ACT AS TO ALIMONY SHOW METHODS AND INDUSTRIES

(By Associated Press)  
WASHINGTON, Aug. 23.—Officials of the American commission to the Brazilian Centennial Exposition to be held at Rio de Janeiro beginning September 7, today announced that Brazilian government authorities had decided to hold an elaborate individual exposition in connection with the commemoration of the first centenary of the political independence of Brazil. The exposition, it was explained, will be designed to portray the principal industries of Brazil and their methods.

The exposition will be held in the building of the old War Arsenal (Arsenal de Guerra) and dependencies. Foreign government or industrial organizations are proposed to erect, on their own account, pavilions for the export of products of their own country. The pavilions will be spaced reserved for in an area adjacent to the main exposition area. Title to lots, it was said, will be ceded special favor.

MENTOR GIVEN JAIL SENTENCE

TOKIO, July 15.—(By Mail)—Tetsuichi Aoki, a former professor of the Tokyo Imperial University, was sentenced to four months' imprisonment because of an article in the Oriental Current Review, which he had written in the accusation of his being disrespectful to the emperor.


