STUDENTS CAN WORK THEIR WAY

CORVALLIS, Aug. 23.—A young man or woman who is able and willing to work, and who has enough cash on hand to finance his first term at college can generally earn most of his expenses and go to school at the same time. This has been the experience of many self-supporting students at the Oregon Agricultural college.

Domestic labor, such as table service, dish washing, general house work, house cleaning, gardening, etc., is always in demand, and students who are in good health and able to do such work efficiently.

They can earn board by three hours' work a day, or board and room by four

hours work a day. Efficient stenographers are in considerable demand but there is an over-supply of those wishing to teach and do clerical work.

Work is obtained much more easily after students are familiar with local conditions, and it is considered advisable for every student to be sure of having enough money to pay his first term's expenses before coming to college. About \$50 cash is required for the initial outlay.
