

GRID GAMES START SOON

Football Preparing to Supercede Baseball; Tentative Schedule of Far West Teams Given.

(By Associated Press.)
SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 24.—Football is getting ready to kick off for the 1922 season and, in a short time, the gridiron game will edge baseball out of the sporting spotlight.

Although practice at the Pacific Coast Conference schools cannot start until September 15, most of the varsity candidates will be out in uniform when the universities and colleges open late this month and early next month.

University of Santa Clara probably will play the first game of the season when it meets the team from the U. S. S. California on Admission Day, September 9. Not until September 20 will the larger colleges swing into action.

TO TEST NEW AERO-TORPEDO

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 24.—Efficiency of the navy's new aero-torpedo attack will be tested in the first maneuvers of the Pacific fleet after its return to local waters next month.

A sham sea battle, in which dreadnaughts will pit their prowess against the deadly swiftness of torpedo planes, is to be staged in the waters off Santa Catalina island, famous among sportsmen as the scene of many a thrilling battle between adventurous anglers and the fighting tuna or swordfish.

The ships of the battle force will put to sea from the Los Angeles base and the attempt to return to port without being detected by "enemy" air squadrons. Meanwhile, speedy scout planes will hop off from the air station at San Diego and will endeavor to locate the fleet and report its position to the slower torpedo planes. When these are given the position of the approaching fleet they will set out from shore, release their torpedoes in the midst of the battleships and dart out of reach of the anti-aircraft guns.

These maneuvers will take place within 50 miles of shore, on account of the necessity of the torpedo planes starting from a shore base, but in December, when the new airplane carrier Langley arrives, similar tests will be conducted about 200 miles at sea.

The Pacific fleet is scheduled to arrive here September 12.

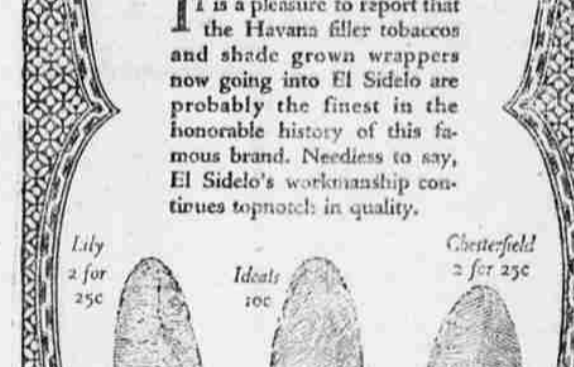

every buyer. "The surprising thing about this tire price reduction is that labor and material costs have not dropped proportionately.
