A late news reel will also be shown.

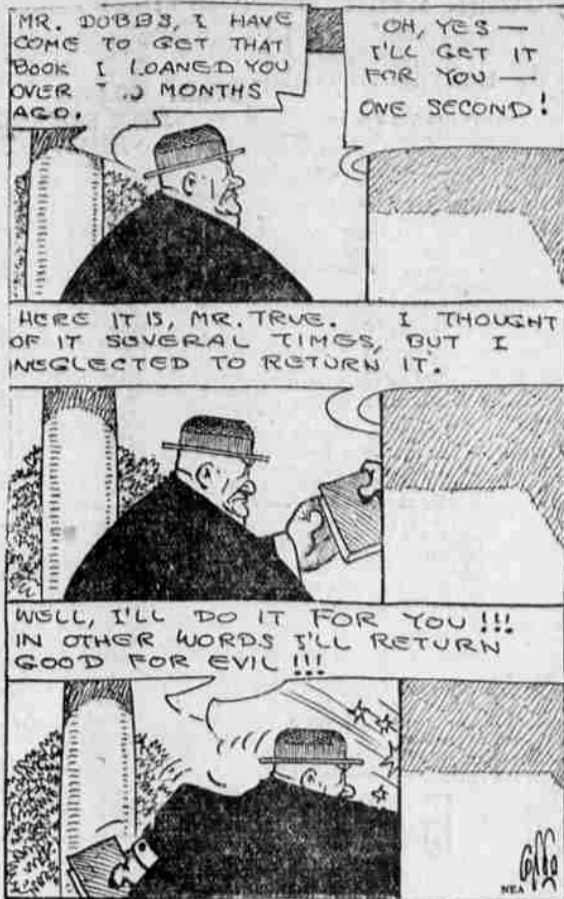
AT SHERRY'S TODAY, ALICE LAKE IN "OVER THE WIRE."

NO DECOYS IN CITY LIMITS

(By Associated Press.) PULLMAN, Wash., Aug. 24.—The way of the Pullman duck hunter is beset with thorns. For instance, the city officials have ruled that he must keep his decoy geese outside city limits, where their more or less incessant honking will not disturb the neighbors and cause them to lose sleep.

Prof. F. C. Chalfant, head of the foreign language department at Washington State College, is an enthusiastic sportsman. His stock of equipment includes several wild geese which he uses for decoys. But the neighbors complained to the chief of police, who referred the matter to the city council. The city fathers, after consulting the ordinance book decided that the geese were violating at least six of the municipal ordinances.

BONUSES NOT TO BE GRANTED

(By Associated Press.) KOBE, Japan, July 23. (By Mail)—Despite the demands from the local steamship companies for increased bonuses, or a loan, to tide over the present period of depression, the government is not likely to grant the request. On lines which are now paying, on the other hand, the bonuses will be decreased, the amount saved being diverted to those companies operating unprofitable routes or to enable companies to improve their services.

At a recent meeting of representatives of the Japanese steamship companies, the Nippon Yusen Kaisha, the Toyo Kisen Kaisha, the Osaka Shosen Kaisha and Mitsui Bussan Kaisha remaining out as they have already received mail subsidies, it was decided to organize for the purpose.

FIVE MILLION TO GET MARRIED

(By Associated Press.) TOKIO, July 15. (By Mail)—Simplicity will be the keynote of the wedding ceremonies of the Prince Regent to Princess Nagako Kuni, the total expenditures being estimated at 5,000,000 yen. Two-thirds of this will be expended in preparation of the marriage and the purchase of gifts, while one-third will be required for the ceremony itself, the erection of special buildings, banquets and coaches for the procession.

The Prince Regent's betrothal gift to the Princess will be a small sword decorated with the Imperial crest of gold chrysanthemums. It is now being made by a famous swordsmith of Osaka.

The Princess' trousseau includes both foreign dresses and kimono, a crown and necklaces whose value is estimated at 1,000,000 yen. Her ceremonial robes are being manufactured in Kyoto at a cost of 20,000 yen and twenty chests of drawers of paulownia wood valued at 1,000 yen each will contain her kimono for all the four seasons.

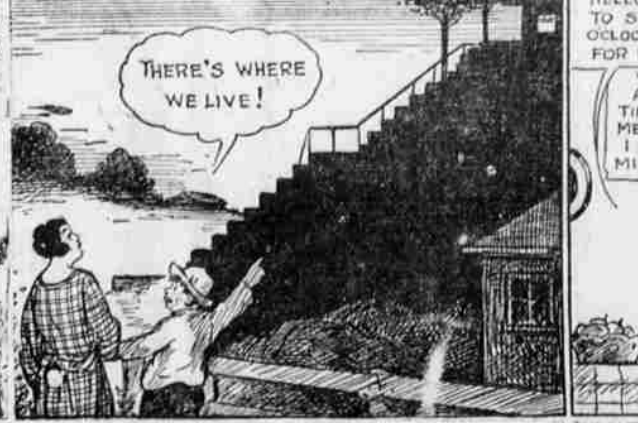
Three thousand persons will be entertained at the Imperial banquet given by the emperor, the first of a series of celebrations in connection with an event upon which the nation attaches great importance.
