FINE ROLE FOR ALMA RUBENS; LAST DAY AT SHERRY'S.

Alma Rubens, who is the featured player in "Find the Woman," a Cosmopolitan Production released by Paramount, is a descendant of Peter Paul Rubens, the famous Flemish painter. By a peculiar coincidence there was placed in one of the settings in the picture—a drawing room in the home of the character interpreted by Miss Rubens a bronze statuette of the great painter.

The actress, while not an adept at handling the palette, is thoroughly at home in any art museum; indeed she spends much of her spare time in the Metropolitan Museum in New York City.

In "Find the Woman" Miss Rubens plays a part well suited to her outstanding talents. She is seen as Sophia Carey, a concert singer, who befriends a girl from a country town who is in New York to try to make her way on the stage. The two young women are strangely involved in a murder mystery, one of the most sensational in years. It is known that about the time the victim was killed in his office a woman was seen leaving the room by way of a fire escape. Thus it is up to the police to "find the Woman."

Arthur Somers Roche wrote the story for Cosmopolitan Magazine and Doty Hohart adapted it to the screen. It was directed by Tom Terras, who also directed "Boomerang Bill" with Lionel Barrymore. Eileen Huban, well known on the speaking stage, has an important role, as have George MacQuarrie, Norman Kerry, Harrison Ford, Ethel Duray and Henry Sedley.

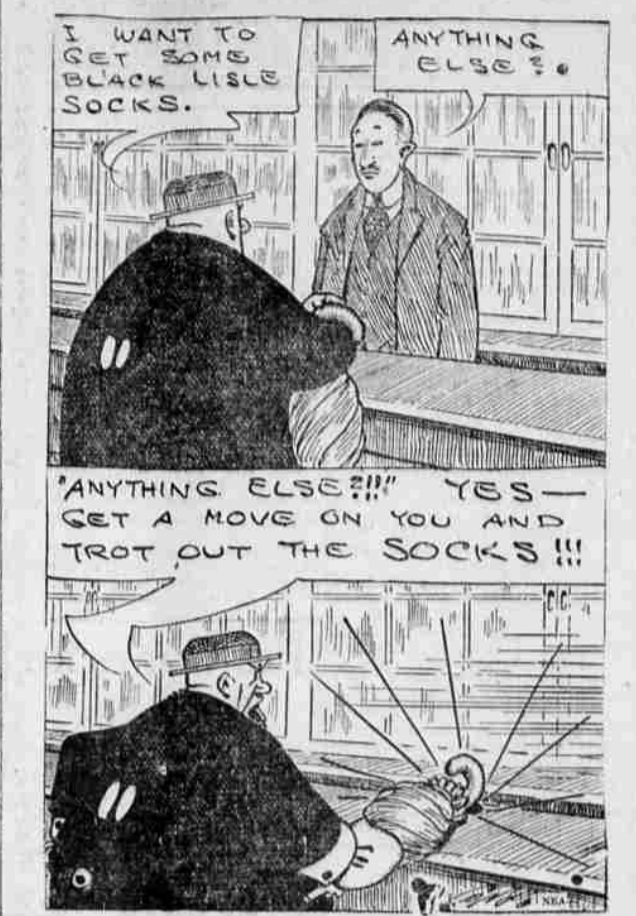

HOMERS MADE IN PORTLAND

(By Associated Press) PORTLAND, Aug. 30—Nearly one and one-half hours runs to a game—1-4, to be exact—have been knocked out in the Portland park of the Pacific Coast Baseball League this season. Nothing like it ever has been seen here before, and the average, if kept up all season, will make a total of 141, compared with 87 of last year. The 87th homer this year was hit by Brown of Oakland on August 23. Up to the middle of August, there had been 102 four-baggers in 73 games. Of this number, the Beavers hit 56 and the opposing clubs 45. Jimmy Middleton and Rube Walberg were the principal Portland hitters to yield over-the-fence smacks, with eight off each, while four visiting pitchers were picked for four home runs apiece. The greatest suffered in any one game was Rube of Sacramento, who was hit for four of them in one afternoon, the disaster occurring on Decoration Day.
