## LARGE TRACTS TO GET WATER

Irrigation in the Bend Country to Increase Agricultural Area Very Materially.

BEND, Ore., Sept. 5.—While Jefferson county still sits in anticipation as the threshold of irrigation development, she is not content to follow any policy except that of securing the maximum yield from her excellent acreage by modern dry farm methods.

Two great developments are under way in the extension of irrigation, developments which will liquidate hundreds of thousands of dollars through construction of dams, canals and ditches and which will bring 25,000 acres of new land under water, lands suitable as homes for a thriving industrial people.

The state-owned project, the Tumalo irrigation district, has secured water storage rights in Crescent lake and has successfully floated a bond issue of over \$500,000 for the purpose of completing its system. Ten thousand acres of land will be watered in addition to the 7000 already irrigated by the summer flow of the Tumalo river.

The United Contract company of Portland has the work already under way. The outlet of Crescent lake will be dammed and the winter's flow stored there for next year's use. A diversion dam is being constructed in the Deschutes within the city limits and from here a large canal will carry the water to the Tumalo.

The North Canal company into whose possession has passed certain water rights and interests formerly owned by the Central Oregon Irrigation district, has begun construction of a dam in the river at Crane prairie for the purpose of impounding sufficient water on this 8000 acre prairie to irrigate 25,000 acres of land in different parts of Deschutes and Crook counties.

This company is controlled by Oswald West and his associates and last year started construction work of the dam. The development of land by this company will proceed in 500 acre units and they are planning a large colonization program that will settle the land as it is brought under water.

## COLLEGE HAS BUNT REMEDY

COVALLIS, Sept. 5.—Bunt, or stinking smut of wheat, the cause of great crop losses in Oregon and other states, may be controlled or completely eradicated through planting resistant or immune varieties rapidly being developed, it is reported by Horace Woolman, field agent, office of cereal investigations, United States Department of Agriculture.

Wheat bunt can be controlled by an entire change in the system of farming or by production of resistant varieties, the Oregon Agricultural Experiment station believes. Rapid progress is being made by the station and it is the belief of the specialists that it will be but a short time before all the susceptible varieties of wheat grown in Oregon can be replaced by immune or highly resistant ones having all other desirable qualities.

Rusts, Hessian fly, chinch bugs, and other enemies have from time to time caused immense losses, but the bunt has steadily taken its toll in all parts of Oregon where wheat is grown. Farmers of Oregon lose thousands of dollars from the treatment of seed for bunt because of seed killed or injured by treatment. Losses due to treatment can be avoided by sowing clean,

bluish seed which has been fanned and removing all foreign matter, including smut balls, and most of the cracked and injured kernels.

"Treatment of seed by the bluestone-lime method is important," says Mr. Woolman. "This solution is made of one pound of bluestone mixed with five to ten gallons of water. Dip the seed five minutes, drain 15 minutes, and dip in milk of lime—one pound of lime to ten gallons of water. The stronger solution is advisable only when seed is sown in bunt-infested soil. Bluestone-treated seed should be washed. Treatment by seed soaking of one pint of commercial formaldehyde solution to 40 to 45 gallons of water is effective. Dip three to five minutes, drain, and plant within 24 hours in soil sufficiently moist for prompt growth. Good results with

formaldehyde-treated seed can be obtained by treating the seed one day and sowing it the next.
