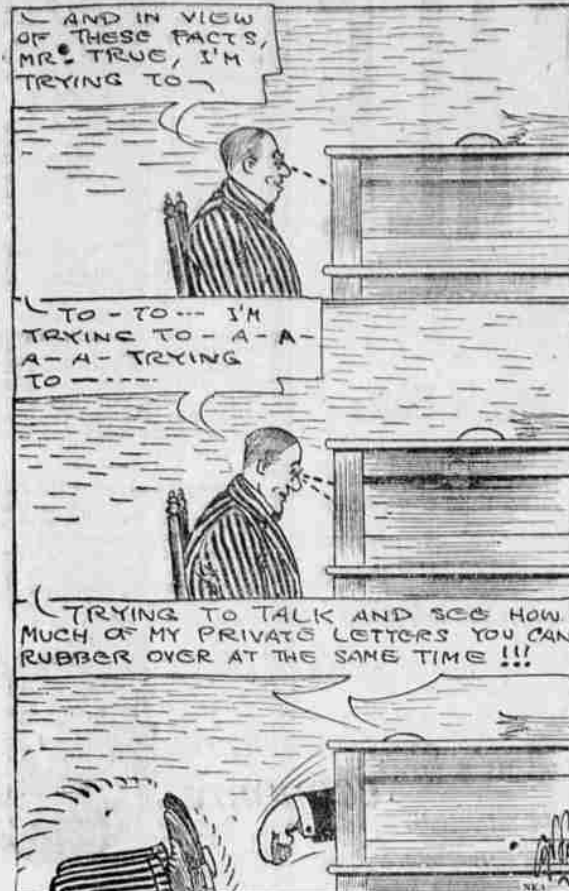

VIRGIN ISLANDS NO LONGER LURE

(By Associated Press.)

CHARLOTTE AMELIA, St. Thomas, Virgin Islands, Aug. 4.—(By Mail)—The Virgin Islands are now officially "dry" and the Volstead Act is in force, but Rear Admiral Kittelle, the naval governor, by official publication, has announced that there are no funds provided by law for the enforcement of the act and that the police officers in the island will have to watch out for violations which will be punishable in the local courts.

The period of time granted for the disposal of liquor stocks on hand expired July 20. A commission is now in Washington urging modification of the law to permit the sale of liquors as ships stores in order to prevent foreign ships giving up St. Thomas as a port of call.
