

FOREST FIRE AT PERRY IS CURBED

Several Other Fires Reported in County; One Near Palmer Junction Might Prove Serious; Prompt Action Being Taken.

The forest fire that swept about 800 acres of pasture land and land covered with scrub timber on the hillside above Perry is practically under control this afternoon. Fire Warden L. H. Russell increased his force this morning and with eight men on the scene, the fire was practically curbed late this afternoon.

The fire is approaching a line of heavy timber on the top of the mountain and if it should break out again serious loss would probably result. Indications are that no such break will occur unless heavy winds should appear. The damage is light. Raymond McKennon and Harry Cadwell are the owners of the land that was swept by the fire.

Several Small Fires.

In addition to the above fire several small fires were reported in Union county yesterday and today. None of them appear to be of a serious nature.

Floyd W. Kendall, district forest ranger, investigated a fire that was reported yesterday afternoon about three miles from Summerville and discovered that it was practically under control. The blaze had started along the creek, apparently by carelessness on the part of a hunter or fisherman, and had eaten its way over about three acres of stubble, shrubs and small timber.

Another fire was reported on the Minam river today. It is located near the mouth of the river north of Mt. Harris. Fire Warden Russell left for the scene this afternoon.

Fire Near Palmer Junction.

Another fire that might develop into a serious blaze was reported about eighteen miles north of Palmer Junction in a heavily timbered district. The fire had made little headway, due to the high altitude and the resulting low fire hazard. A forest ranger left early this morning for the scene and has not reported to La Grande as to the conditions.

GRAZING LOOKS PROMISING

Grazing is looking very fine on the hills and mountains in this district according to Forest Ranger Floyd Kendall, who has just completed a survey of the range conditions in the Umatilla National Forest. Mr. Kendall returned to La Grande Monday and he stated that every indication points to a bountiful range until the closing dates.

The sheep will be taken from the hills not later than October 10 and cattle will make their exit not later than October 31. The recent rains that were experienced started the range to growing green and unless an exceptionally dry season is in store the range will easily last until the closing dates.

That the boundaries of the district to be improved and benefited by the said proposed improvement as finally adopted by the commission are as follows, to-wit: Commencing at a point on the center line of Adams Avenue 112.9 feet Northwest from the center line of Hemlock Street; thence at right angles to said center line in a Northerly direction to the center of the alley in Block 110 Chaplin's Addition to the City of La Grande; thence in an Easterly direction to the most Southerly corner of Lot 9 in Block 110; thence in a Northerly direction along the lot line between Lots 6 and 7 said Block 110 to the Southerly line of Jefferson Avenue; thence in a Northerly direction to the most Southerly corner of Lot 7, Block 117, Chaplin's Addition to the City of La Grande; thence in a Northerly direction following the lot line between Lots 7 and 8 said Block 117 and its extension to the center line of the O-W-R. & N. company's main line right of way; thence on a curve to the right following the center line of the O-W-R. & N. company's right of way commonly called the Joseph Branch, to the City limits; thence South along the East city limits to the center line of Q Avenue; thence West along the center line of Q Avenue to a point opposite the lot line between Lots 4 and 5 Block 22 Williamson's Addition to the City of La Grande; thence South at right angles following the aforesaid line between Lots 4 and 5 said Block 22 to the center line of the alley in said Block 22; thence West to the intersection with the Northerly extension of the lot line between Lots 6 and 7, Block 23, Williamson's Addition to the City of La Grande; thence South along the line between said Lots 6 and 7, Block 23, and its extension to the center line of East Pennsylvania Avenue; thence West along the center line of East Pennsylvania Avenue to the center line of Pine Street; thence South along the center line of Pine Street

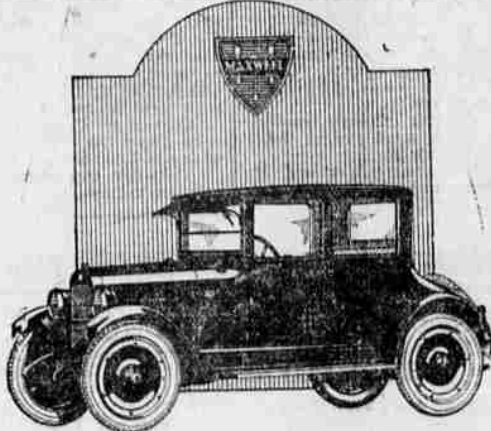

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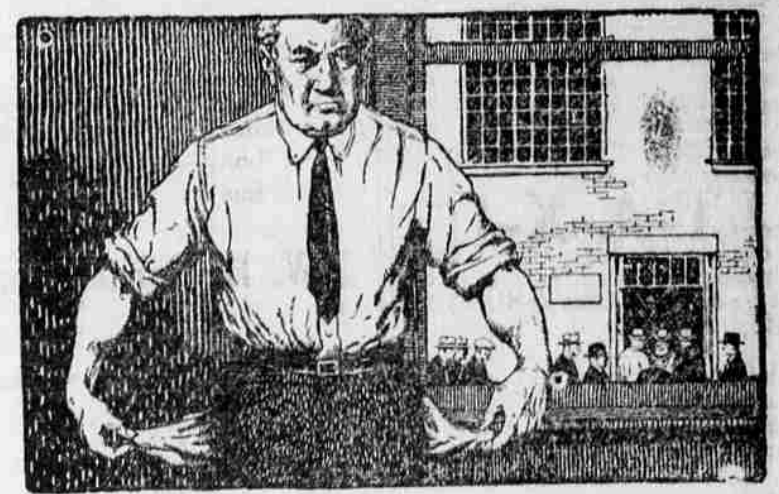
