CONTINENT IS DRIFTING
(By Associated Press.)
LONDON, Sept. 14.—Is the American continent drifting westward and slowly leaving Europe behind? It is, if the theory propounded to the advantage of the British Association at Hull by the German geologist, Wegener, is correct. Doctor Wegener declares that the various continents originally were joined at the poles, but that now they are slowly drifting away from the poles and from east to west. America is moving westward faster than Europe, he said, and Greenland will faster than America. He added that this movement had been proven by experiments at observatories in Europe and at Washington.

In the discussion which followed Professor Turner of Oxford said there was no astronomical observation worthy of serious consideration in support of Wegener's theory.

THEATRES
