

LA GRANDE LINE APPEARS WEAK

With the first week of practice behind them the La Grande football squad is shaping up for the season's work. Prospects look very encouraging for the backfield and end positions but the line appears weakly weak. Coach Reynolds has hopes for his line however as Captain Alstott, Spencer, Moore and Keyes, all linemen, will probably join the squad next week.

Prospects for the backfield are Shivers, C. Garrity, Larson, Bearden and Lynch. Others are trying out and may be able to out some of the present favorites for the position.

Ends will probably be picked from Price, Webb, E. Metcalf, Jacobson and Garrick. Tommy Russell looks like good material for the second team end.

Smutz is showing up well at center and other linemen who are looking good are Bean, G. Metcalf, Kerr, Steinbeck, R. Garrity and Glenn.

Schedule Incomplete.

The schedule is not complete as yet with a chance of either Walla Walla or Prairie City being added to the list of competitors. As it stands now the opening game of the season will be with Imbler at La Grande on September 20. October 7 will probably be a game between the first and second team. October 14 is the date that will be filled by either Walla Walla or Prairie City. October 21 the team will journey to Elgin, and on October 28 Pendleton will be invaded. November 4 is still open but in all likelihood the Alumni high school game will be arranged then. November 11 will find Baker here and on November 18 La Grande goes to Union. November 20, Thanksgiving day, La Grande will play Enterprise.

A large number of second team games will be arranged this year. Negotiations for games with Union, Elgin and others are under way. Armistice Day, November 11, will also find Imbler and Union high schools playing on the local field.

PRISONERS LIKE VIOLIN

LONDON, Aug. 25, (By Mail).—E. Percy Brown is a comparatively young man, with a young man's enthusiasm for reform. He wants to make prisoners better and happier men inside the jail, and to give them a chance to make good when they get out. He is governor of Dorchester Goal, where he is trying certain experiments that come to him from the United States, and the Home Office is watching them to see how they turn out.

The effects of the new treatment already are pronounced to be amazing. The tone of the prison is excellent and the general conduct of the prisoners is very good. And this in spite of the protests raised by the old type of prison authorities against undermining discipline by introducing "flashy American methods."

Music is Mr. Brown's most powerful instrument of amelioration. Nearly every week he organizes good concerts. The prisoners display a real hunger for these events, and the better the music the better they like them, showing an almost pathetic delight in violin solos of the higher class.

JUDGE OLMSTEAD IS DEAD.
