AT SHERRY'S LAST DAY.

An eighty-five mile per hour "bug!" This small car, perhaps the fastest for its size ever built, was especially constructed and equipped to hold the honor place in the transcontinental race which is the principal feature of Wallace Reid's new Paramount picture, "Across the Continent," to be presented at the Sherry Theatre for the last time today.

The machine is about the size of a stripped down Ford. It was equipped with all the features of the racing cars, however, including Deleo ignition system, Miller racing carburetor and Perfecto two-speed axle.

The car was geared three-to-one and was capable of attaining a speed of eighty-five miles per hour, although, according to the star, it was hard to hold it to the road when it reached its maximum speed.

Eddie Heffernan, expert mechanic, who was forced to retire from the racing game because of injuries received in a speed contest, spent several weeks getting the car in shape and perfect running order, and then acted as "nurse" to the car during the making of the picture.

GENERAL IS MADE DICTATOR

General Diedrichs has Been Chosen Dictator of the Primoria in Serbia.

(By Associated Press.)
VLADIVOSTOK, Siberia, Aug. 18 (By Mail).—General Diedrichs has been chosen dictator of the Primoria by 219 votes against 13.

N. Gondatti withdrew his nomination at the last moment, although his candidature was assured. Old political observers of Gondatti were convinced that he would never accept the post and that it was only the desire to keep himself in the public eye that allowed the nomination to be presented. As the former governor general of the Primoria, Mr. Gondatti was considered one of the best administrators this district ever had.

The work done by his mission in the survey and study of the Primoria was very complete and the results of its investigations published in twenty volumes is still the standard work. He refused the ministry of commerce under the Czar in order to devote all his energies to the Far East and in the zenith of his power he was invested with almost viceregal authority. His name, as an administrator, is one of the most respected among the Russians of the Far East and hence their desire to elect him dictator.

On August 8th, General Diedrichs was inducted into the dictatorship. The seals of office were handed over to him by the former head of the temporary temporary government, S. D. Merkuloff, after a solemn service in the cathedral.

PER CAPITA CASH LARGER
WASHINGTON, Sept. 18.—Every body's cash on hand increased by 46 cents during August, according to circulation statement issued by the treasury.

On September 1 the per capita circulation of money throughout the country was \$29.92, as compared with \$28.47 on August 1, and with \$42.99 on September 1st a year ago.

The total amount of money in circulation on September 1 was \$4,393,569,627, while the population of the country was estimated at 110,017,000 persons.

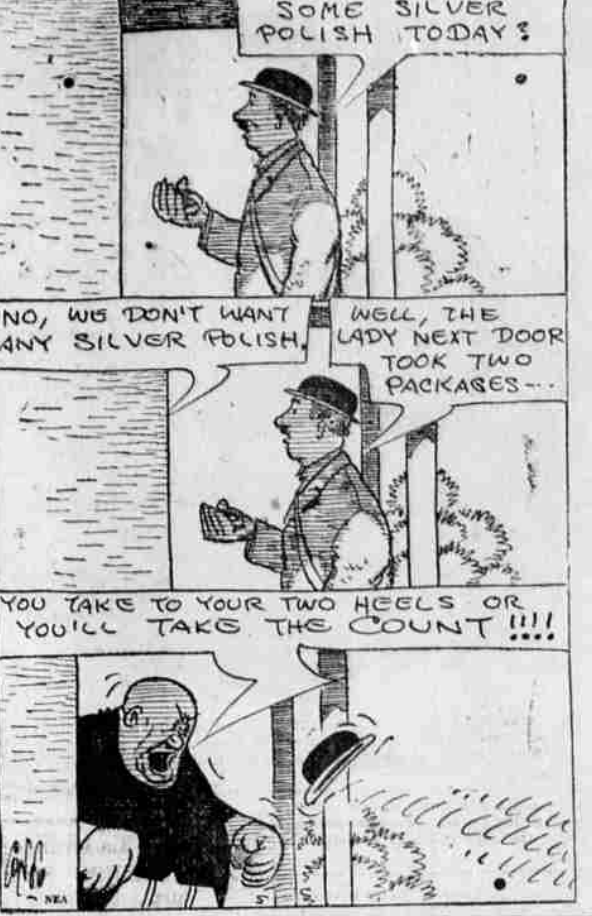
