Pearson Brothers have fixed up their threshing outfit and are busy at work. This outfit does good work and is busy throughout the threshing season.

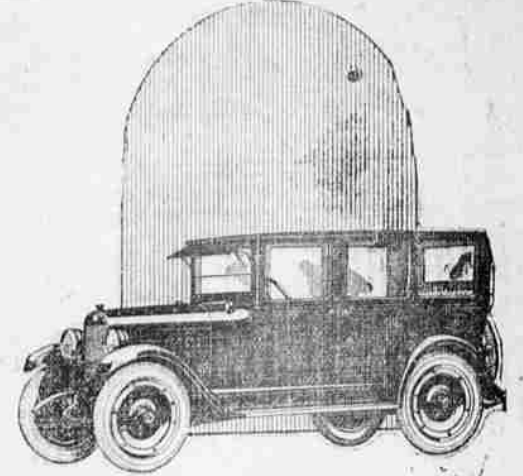
The city has installed a cop on main street to show people how to turn to the right. This has been needed for some time and may save a dangerous accident.

Callow entered the university in 1912, made the freshman crew that year and the varsity crew the three succeeding years. In his sophomore year he was a member of the four-oared crew that accompanied the varsity eight to Poughkeepsie, and rowed in the shell that competed in the national classic the following year. In 1915, his senior year, he was elected captain of the varsity shell, and returning for additional work in 1917-19 was elected president of the student body.

#### ST. MARY'S GRID CHANCES ARE GOOD

OAKLAND, Calif., Sept. 19.—Sixty candidates have answered Coach "Slim" Madigan's call for football practice at St. Mary's College here. Nine of the men are veterans of the 1921 team.

Only one man has been lost from the backfield and four of the line positions will be filled by veterans. Stars from the St. Marys prep of last year will fight for the other posts.

St. Marys has a heavy schedule ahead which will close with the "big game" against the University of Santa Clara, a rival of a decade ago. This will be the first time in ten years that Santa Clara and St. Marys meet.

#### NORTHERN COLLEGE OPENS ITS DOORS

FAIRBANKS, Alaska, Sept. 19.—Located farther north than any other institution of higher learning in the world, the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines opened its doors here this month. Registration began on September 11 and instruction started Monday. Charles E. Bunnell, former federal judge here, is president of the new college.

### U. OF W. HAS ALUMNI COACH

Appointment of Callow as Rowing Coach is in Line with University's Policy.

SEATTLE, Wn., Sept. 19.—Recent appointment of Russell Callow as rowing coach of the University of Washington is directly in line with the policy of the school, which calls for the establishment of a general alumni coaching system.

Callow is a former Purple and Gold oarsman and crew captain and was considered by the late Coach Alvan Conner as one of his best men. He was the unanimous choice of the Board of Control of the Associated Students, his name coming before them with the recommendation of the Board of Rowing Stewards and the unofficial sanction of the University of Washington crew which won second place in the 1922 Poughkeepsie regatta. Callow is considered by close followers of the rowing game here as a worthy successor to Ed Leader, last year's coach and now under contract to Yale.

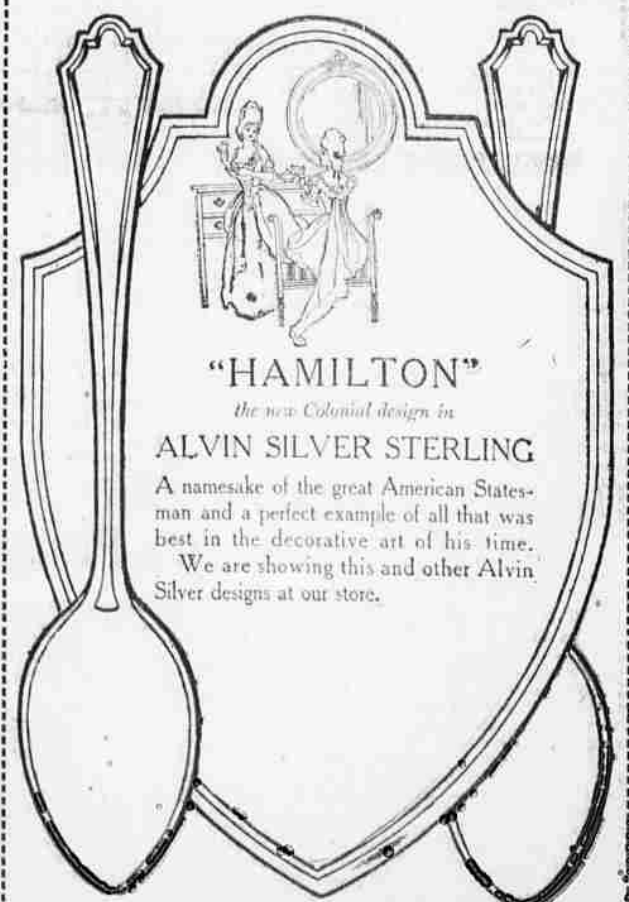
