### JAPAN SEEKS COMPROMISE

(By Associated Press.) CHANGCHUN, Manchuria, Sept. 22.—Decision of Japan on the Russian soviet government proposal that the Changchun conference between Japan, China and the Moscow government consider the whole Russian question, is expected by the delegates here of the three governments within a few days. Meanwhile negotiations have been halted. It is generally believed here that Japan will offer a compromise to the soviet request, suggesting that the Moscow and China delegates sit with equal footing, but limiting the question of discussion solely to Siberian affairs. It was said in certain sources here that Japan desires not to discuss questions concerning European Russia without participation in such a conference of other interested powers.

## BALLOT NOT TO CARRY THE BILL

### Income Tax Measure is Denied Ballot Space Because of Illegality in Securing Names.

PORTLAND, Sept. 22.—Wholesale forgeries and fraud in connection with the circulation of initiative petitions were resolutely judicially in a decision handed down by George R. Bingham and Percy R. Kelly, Marion county circuit judges, yesterday, enjoining Secretary of State Kester from giving a place on the November ballot to the income graduated income tax measure.

Neither will the so-called salmon fishing and fish propagation amendment submitted by G. G. Green of West Linn, Clatsop county, go on the ballot unless a decree also handed down yesterday by the same judges, according to word received here, is reversed by the supreme court. An order restraining the secretary of state from certifying the measure to the county clerks was made a part of the decree.

The decision in the income tax case was reached after a hearing in Multnomah county during which 365 witnesses testified to the reprehensible conduct of petition circulators in this district. A transcript of all testimony pertaining to the fraud has been ordered by Stanley Myers, district attorney, and law violations will be placed before the grand jury.

Commissioners to be Revoked. Governor Olcott undoubtedly will revoke the ministerial commissions of these men," declared Mr. Myers last night "and vigorous prosecutions will follow any indictments. Unfortunately the initiative law is rather vague

## OSAKA IS MOST EXPENSIVE CITY

OSAKA, Japan, Aug. 17 (By Mail)—Osaka, the industrial capital of Japan, has the reputation of being the most expensive city of empire in which to live. The price of commodities in Osaka in June averaged 8.7 per cent over the same month last year. Tokyo, the next expensive city, advanced 6.5 per cent. The general advance in prices in ten years has been 156.25 per cent in Osaka and 136.84 per cent in Tokyo, according to official figures.

Believing that the high prices are due to profiteering, the government recently ordered the department stores to make a reduction of 15 per cent in necessities. The stores replied with bargain sales at which they got rid of their surplus stock. That did not satisfy the government, so an order was issued out to all retailers to reduce the prices of "necessaries," a list of macaroni and "tofu" bean paste, staple foods of the people. If present weather conditions continue a good crop is expected to bring down the price of rice.

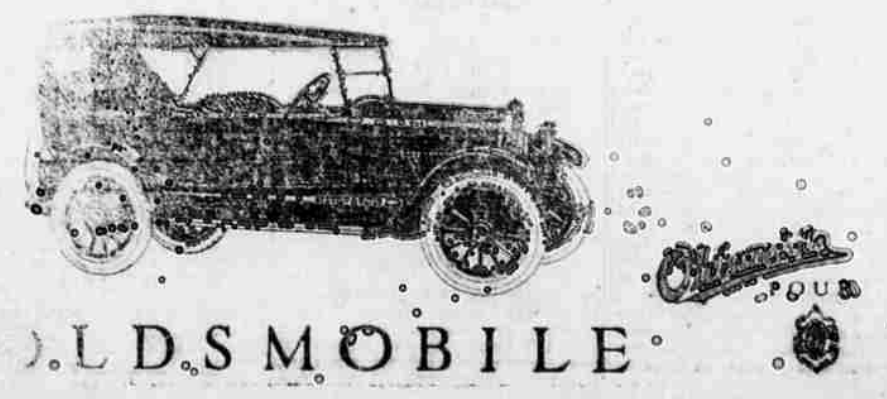
