

RADIO OF USE TO NEWSPAPERS

House of Commons Believes That Radio Broadcasting is Good Supplement.

(By Associated Press.)
LONDON, Sept. 21. (By Mail).—Vigorous protest has been made in the House of Commons against the plan of Postmaster General Kellaway against granting to a combine of instrument makers for two years the right of wireless broadcasting in England, and a monopoly of the sale of receiving instruments. The plan, if adopted, will exclude American and other foreign-made wireless apparatus.
Captain Wedgwood Benn, member of parliament, said broadcasting should be considered as a supplement to newspapers. He declared it marked the biggest development in the dissemination of information since the invention of the printing press. It was not right, he argued, that the development of wireless broadcasting should be left in the hands of a combine.
The speaker asked the postmaster-general what arrangements had been made for the copyright of newspaper dispatches. He said when a newspaper had at great expense obtained a item of news, it ought to enjoy the monopoly of it for a period of at least 24 hours.
Mr. Kellaway said there would be no monopoly. Every one of the manufacturers of apparatus could become a member of the broadcasting company. "We have to keep this new form of communication in the hands of our own people," he proceeded. "Whether in the matter of broadcasting or reception, our manufacturers have a technical skill and a capacity of production equal to any in the world. I am advised that in the two years \$20,000,000 will be spent in the purchase of receiving apparatus and erection of broadcasting stations, and 80 per cent of this will go in wages."

TUBERCULOSIS DEATH RATE LOW

(By Associated Press.)
NEW YORK, Sept. 22.—The death rate from all forms of tuberculosis, in the year 1921, reached the remarkably low level of 50.7 per 100,000 population. This information has been obtained by the National Tuberculosis Association from the registers of 45 states in the Union.
In 1921 returns from 49 states showed a death rate of 108.3 per 100,000. The decline in 1921 is equivalent, according to the association, to a saving of about 18,000 lives in 1921 over 1920.
The association points out further that since it began its active program in 1905, the tuberculosis death rate has been cut from slightly over 200 to a figure well below 100 per 100,000 population.

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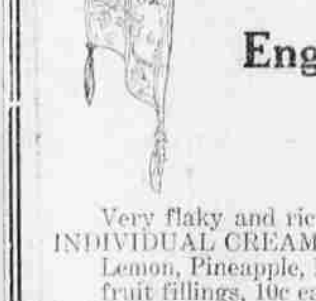

ST. THOMAS NOW BUYS BY MAIL

CHARLOTTE TUALIA, St. Thomas, V. I., Sept. 21. (By Mail).—St. Thomas has been hit by the mail-order bug. From American houses are to be seen everywhere, and postal records indicate that goods amounting to \$1,000 a day are delivered in St. Thomas alone by parcel post on a V. I. basis.
Merchants are indignant that their stores should be thus slighted, but give as a reason for their inability to compete in price with the mail-order houses the fact that there are still loaded up with high priced goods delivered to them by American manufacturers and exporters as soon as shipping facilities were available after the war.

Those who buy by mail say they are able to make considerable savings by buying in the United States, and they are becoming more and more fixed in the habit of ordering from catalogues. Mail-order buying has become such a habit that it is said to be a frequent occurrence for clerks working in the stores to buy by mail, rather than to purchase where they are employed.

One merchant said it was not only the fact that a saving might be made, but that mail-order buyers liked to receive pleasantly worded acknowledgements of their orders, and other letters from the mail-order houses.

Many of the purchases are for small amounts on which the buyer will send two or three dollars in advance, hoping to have sufficient money to pay the balance when the C. O. D. parcels arrive. When the shoes or hat or suit comes to hand and the balance of the money has not been earned, many of the parcels have to be returned, and the prospective purchaser loses his initial payment.
