

INVENTS A NEW SILAGE MACHINE

ENTERPRISE, Sept. 23. — Wal-lawa county is the birthplace of an invention which bids fair to be of great importance. The machine, which is an invention of Phil O. Pollard, living about five miles east of town, is designed to harvest and prepare silage and other ensilage crops for silage. J. P. Morelock has the sole management of the invention, and the International Harvester and other silage machine companies have sent men to look over the machine during the twenty day test run.

The silage machine is driven along the row and the plants are cut off on a belt which carries them to a gas engine driven cutter, which reduces the stalks to the desired size of silage. Another belt carries the cut-up forage to various ready to be put in the silo.

The machine has been found to cut silage at a cost of about a dollar, and a half a ton, and turns out an average of ten tons an hour.

Only two men are required to operate the machine, which Mr. Pollard manufactured himself, and further improvements are expected to increase its efficiency. The machine can be seen working this and next week near Lostine. The owners expect to sell the machine, the royalty or the patent as a good deal of interest has been shown by manufacturers and users.

MODERN WORK IS WONDERFUL

Miss Helen Aldrich, of La Grande, Will Soon Walk Normally Due to Three Successful Operations.

In the present times modern surgery has no limits. Or, so it seems, according to the following description of a Mayo operation on a La Grande girl.

The fact is brought home to the people of La Grande graphically by the recent operations that have been performed on Miss Helen Aldrich, daughter of Ira R. Aldrich, district Sunday school superintendent of Eastern Oregon, by Mayo Brothers, of Rochester, Minnesota, famed the world over for their surgical achievements.

Mr. Aldrich left La Grande Tuesday morning for Rochester to bring his daughter back to her home at the conclusion of three very successful operations. His daughter was suffering from a mishapen right leg and had been forced to walk with the aid of crutches, but it conditions are favorable within a short time she will be able to walk without the aid of crutches or any other artificial supports.

The first operation was in the month of May and at that time her foot and leg were operated upon but when the wounds healed her right foot was left with the foot pointing in an awkward position. The matter was attended to successfully in an operation that took place in July when the medical au-

thorities cut her limb off below the knee and reset it correctly. But with this matter attended to the sorbs of the left leg, due to walking on crutches for such a long period, had drawn up and another operation was necessary, and was completed at a recent date.

And now the little girl, who for many years, walked only by aid of crutches, has a normal pair of limbs and, as soon as her period of convalescence is completed, will be able to walk normally.

After introducing his bill, Martin was asked to withdraw it so that it could be amended and introduced at the following session. To all opposition Martin replied with more vigorous support and made a strong appeal at the second reading. After his appeal, a vote was taken and the ayas stood 23 against 15 nays. The bill passed its third reading in the house of commons June 7, 1916.
