

CHURCH GROWS IN CANADA

THE ANNUAL REPORT

TORONTO, Sept. 28.—The annual report of the Methodist Church in Canada for the year 1921, covering the period from 1920 to 1921, was presented to the annual conference of the denomination at Toronto, Sept. 28. Sinclair to Command O. T. C. at U. of O.

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Sept. 28.—Lieutenant Colonel William S. Sinclair, a veteran of six campaigns, has been assigned to command the Reserve Officers' Training Corps at the University of Oregon, succeeding Major Raymond C. Baird, who was assigned to military service and duties for three years. Major Baird returns this year to the General Services School at Fort Leavenworth.

Lieutenant Colonel Sinclair is a native of Texas. Following his graduation from the Michigan Military Academy in 1895, he entered the University of Michigan law school. He was a student at Ann Arbor when war was declared with Mexico, and he enlisted in the Thirty-first Infantry in April 1918. A month later he was discharged to accept a commission as second lieutenant in the First U. S. Volunteer Infantry.

Commissioned in the regular army in July, 1919, Colonel Sinclair has seen service since that date. For four years he was in the Philippines; and in 1920 was a member of the American Relief Expedition to China, serving as a second lieutenant in the Fourteenth Infantry. Sinclair fought in the Battle of Yangtze, in the attack on the outer walls of Peking, and entered the Imperial City after its capture.

From 1920 to 1921 he saw active service during the Cuban Expedition, and was on the border during the trouble with Mexico. During the World War, Colonel Sinclair served with the 20th Infantry and with the 219th and 220th Infantry. At
