

## LIGHT WINE AND BEER FAVORED

Federation of Labor Votes to Modify the Volstead Act in Salem Session.

SALEM, Sept. 29.—A resolution declaring that the proposed income tax amendment, sponsored by the state legislature, was "intended for the obvious purpose of confusing the voters and killing the orange income tax measure," was adopted by the Oregon State Federation of Labor, in session Thursday.

The resolution points out that adoption of the proposed amendment "will throw more of the burden of taxation on the small wage earner," and calls upon organized labor to lend its forces to opposition of the measure.

The convention also went on record as opposed to any movement which sought to destroy the direct primary and bring about the return to the old convention system of nominating candidates for political office.

### Wets Win Fight.

The bitterest fight of the convention was waged around a resolution introduced by the soft drink dispensers urging modification of the Volstead act and a return of "whole some beer and light wines." The resolution was adopted by a vote 25 to 27, with 24 delegates absent, after an oratorical exchange replete with personalities which consumed most of the afternoon.

President Hartwig of the federation, speaking against the resolution, declared that the only effect of the proposal was to drive a wedge into the labor movement to split the organization.

State Insurance Favored. A resolution proposing an amendment to the state compensation act, making acceptance of its provisions compulsory upon all employers was adopted by the convention. Should the legislature fail to pass such an act, the convention before the voters through the medium of the initiative, State Insurance, as administered under the Oregon act, was highly preferable to the protection offered by casualty companies, it was pointed out by supporters of this resolution.

The convention extended to the Portland Central Labor council an offer of assistance in entertaining delegates to the national convention of the American Federation of Labor in Portland next year. It was also proposed that an effort be made to advance the date of the national convention from October to June when Oregon will be at its best.

Free text books for the public schools of Oregon are endorsed in another resolution adopted by the convention Thursday. Free text books printed in the state printing plant, it was argued, would save the taxpayers of the state \$250,000 annually.

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## OLD CARTHAGE BEING SOLD

CARTHAGE, Tenn., French Africa, Sept. 1.—(By Mail)—The site of an ancient Carthage is being sold off in small lots to building speculators, and the surrounding hills, rich in history, are being slowly covered with residential edifices.

Archaeologists point out that if the building is permitted to continue, the excavation work will be badly hampered, as the new propinquities object to the removal of these relics by workmen for matter what remains of history may be obliterated.
