## SCIENTISTS STOP RISING OF FOG IN PITTSBURGH.

PITTSBURGH, Pa., Sept. 30.—A large section of Pittsburgh fog was completely put out of business Wednesday by local scientists, assisted by officials of the weather bureau and experts from the United States engineering department.
