The photography is striking evidence of the progress which latter day film art has shown.

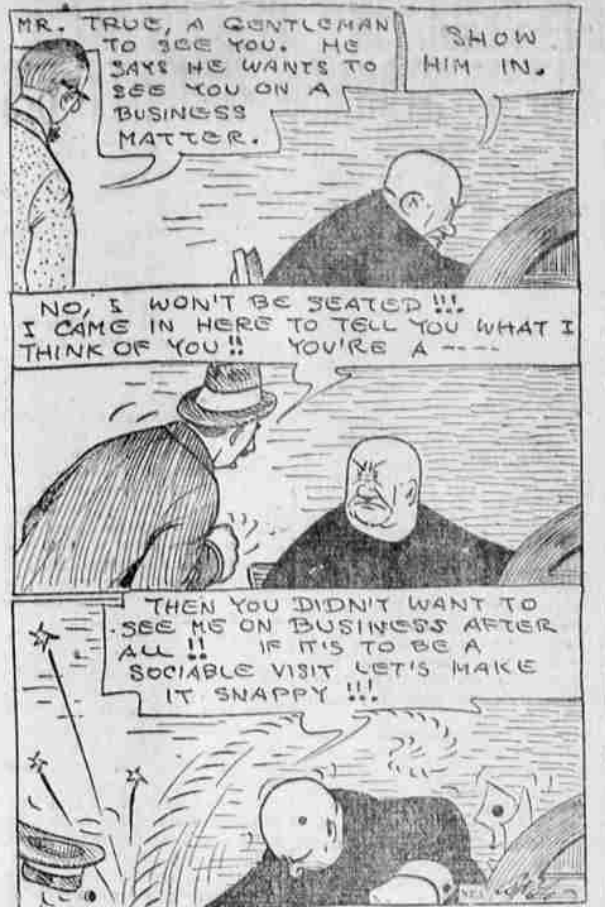

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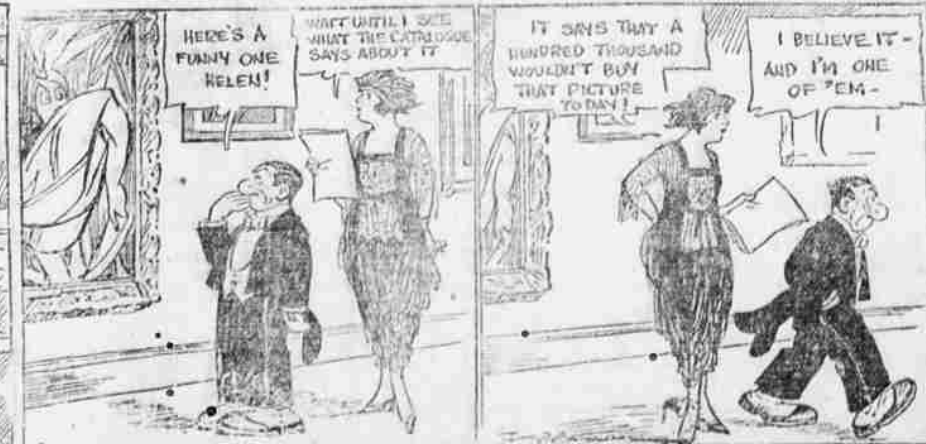
