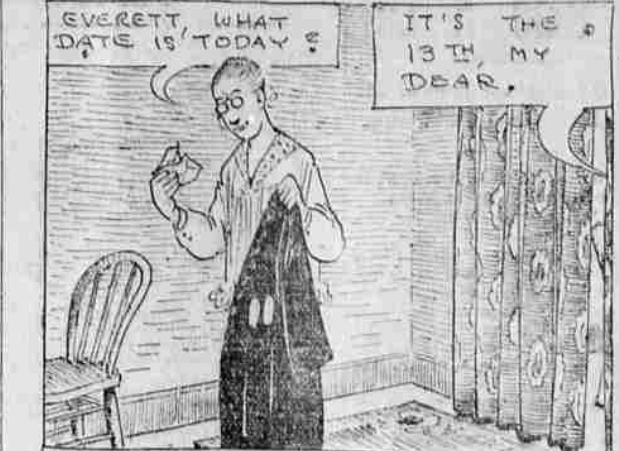

A WESTERN PICTURE WITH A DIFFERENCE AT SHERRYS FOR THE LAST DAY.

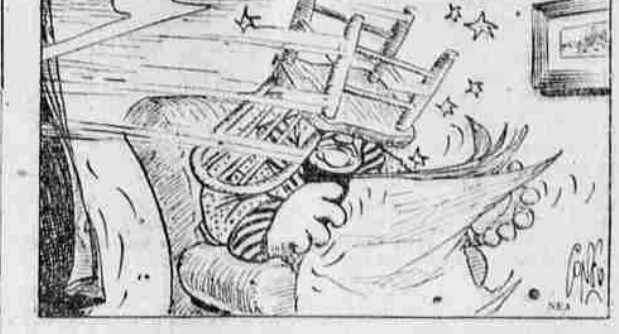
