The Oxford India paper used in Bibles is still manufactured under special conditions which are kept secret, but numerous imitations of good qualities have sprung up.—The Associated Press.

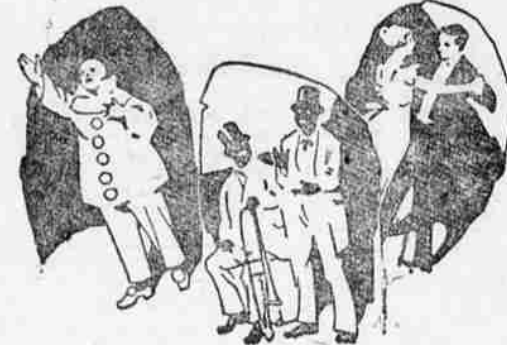
WORTHY OFFERINGS ON THE NEW BILL, PRESENTED AT THE ARCADE THEATRE ON SUNDAY
