## DANGERS MUST HAVE ESCORTS

MANHA, P. I., Sept. 25.—(4) Mail.—The municipal council of Calocogan, San Juan, Poncey and San Pedro Marcas, towns in the province of Iloilo, which among Manila, have issued ordinances barring all ballroom (professional) dancers from entering dance halls in any of these municipalities unless accompanied by escorts. Several years ago the Manila municipal board banished all dance halls from the city, but they sprang up just outside the city limits.

## TO DETERMINE BEDROCK DEPTH

PARADISE, CALIF., Oct. 19.—Diamond drill borings will be started at Lewis Ferry, Ariz., to determine the depth of bedrock for a flood control dam on the Colorado river as a result of a new survey of the canyon by federal and state engineers. The party was headed by E. C. Latta, hydraulic engineer of the United States Geological Survey, and one of the most noted authorities on conditions of the great river.

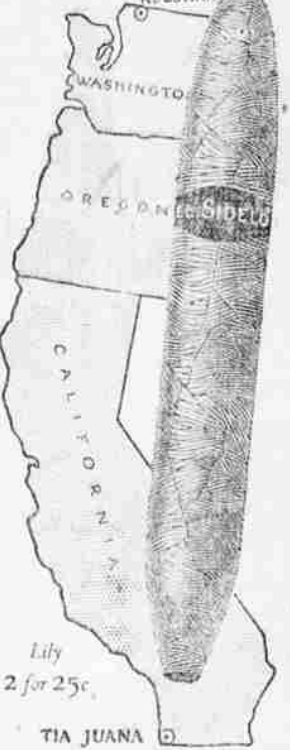
The borings at Lewis Ferry, in the canyon, will determine the depth of the foundation of the proposed dam, and Engineer Latta expressed the opinion that this dam would cost about one-third as much as that suggested at Boulder canyon, and would prove equally effective in controlling the river and protecting the Imperial valley and other sections near the mouth from flood menace.

Four possible dam sites were surveyed by the party and more than a thousand photographs taken.
