

SUMPTOR MILL MAY REOPEN

BAKER, Oct. 18.—It has just been learned that important meetings of the Sumpter Valley Smelter company have been held recently at Spokane and Portland and with detailed information is not obtainable at this time, it has been authoritatively given out that a number of things have been done in the way of progress toward putting the smelter at Sumpter in operation, and that some new people have been added to the list of officers and to the board of trustees, some of which are of particular interest locally.

According to the word received, the management is now composed of J. A. Gyllenberg, president, of Baker, Ore., father of the idea of putting the Sumpter smelter into operation and whose one ambition is to see the plant running to its full capacity and the revival of mining in Eastern Oregon and Western Idaho. J. P. Winter, chairman of the board, a prominent attorney of Portland and well known business man; W. V. Fellows, vice president of Grande, Ore., an aggressive and energetic mine operator, now manager of the Ben Harrison mine, of which he is also part owner, has associated owning large forestry works in Ohio. Mr. Fellows is also commissioner of the Oregon Bureau of Mines and Geology; George P. Larsen, secretary of Portland, closely associated with mining operations in Eastern Oregon and "Cesar d'Almeida" director and familiar to Baker people through his connection with the Bay Horse mine and associations with Mr. Gyllenberg in the smelter enterprise; Guy H. Peterson, treasurer of Boston, now residing in Portland, recently affiliated with the Moscow organization and for many years actively identified in an executive capacity with large financial interests. Mr. Peterson is also interested in the Bay Horse mine and is known in Baker, where he has resided several times; J. L. Magnus, trustee, of Spokane, a well known and mining engineer of considerable repute, having had his headquarters at Spokane for the past 20 years. Mr. Magnus negotiated the deal for the Bay Horse mine between P. H. Miller and the U. S. Metals company and is now the engineer for that company; K. H. Blomster, trustee, of Spokane, for years identified with banking and other business interests and is now devoting his time to the duty of secretary-treasurer in the U. S. Metals company; A. M. Swartley, trustee, Portland, is widely known as a mining engineer, having had varied experience in mining and smelting throughout the West. Mr. Swartley was for several years consulting engineer for the Oregon Bureau of Mines and Geology, having resigned last December in order to devote his time to private mining interests; J. W. Cyers, smelter superintendent of Golden, Colorado, has a record of many years standing in the operation of smelting plants throughout this country as well as Old Mexico and New Zealand. Mr. Cyers made a very careful survey of the Sumpter smelter and the tributary mining districts before accepting the appointment as superintendent and is now in charge of the plant; W. C. Beistol, counsel, is prominently known as one of the leading corporations and business attorneys of Portland.

Although no definite announcement has been made by the company, the recent meeting would indicate that the public might expect official information in the near future and that the smelter company has been completing plans of particular value to its operators.

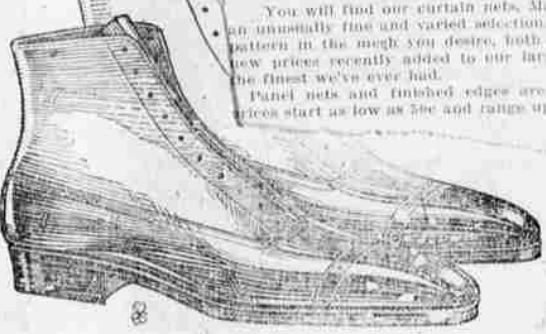
BLUE TIGERS SING THE BLUES

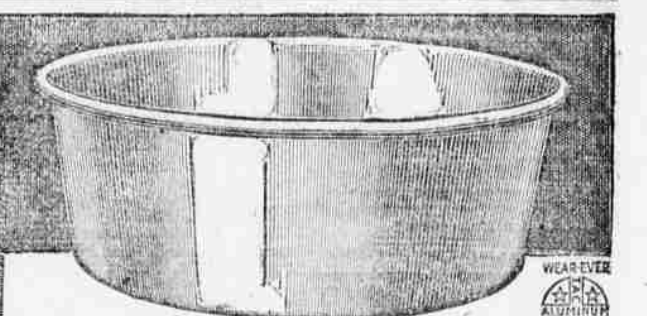
NEW LIVESTOCK MARKET.
