MEMORIAL IS FINE HIGHWAY

Pittsburgh's War Memorial, a Municipal Highway, Proves to Be Very Useful.

(By Association Press.) PITTSBURGH, Oct. 20.—Pittsburgh has officially dedicated a \$2,200,000 memorial to its sons and daughters who served in the World War.

The memorial is a municipal highway called The Boulevard of the Allies. It extends from the business section to the Oakland district, approximately two miles.
